H spent 20+ years in the Coast Guard, specializing in maritime safety and security. Since retiring from the Coast Guard he has been doing what he calls "fun jobs," including home renovation, teaching fire training at SMCC, working at Fess Parker's winery, sergeant at arms at the Vermont State House, town selectman in Cabot.

Jeff then shared the story and photos of his trip to Antarctica right after he joined our club in February, 2022. Due to the regulations in this part of Antarctica, not all of the passengers on their ship were allowed to sleep overnight on the continent but he and Linda were lucky enough to be among the select few, a highlight of this bucket list trip!
