<u>Guests</u> – We were joined this week by Elizabeth McLellan, founder and Executive Director of Partners for World Health – she joined us to learn more about global grants since the club is interested in partnering with them on a global grant application to provide medical equipment and training in Uganda.

#### Miscellaneous Club News: -

- > Sari is leading our club's effort to apply for a district grant to purchase a walk-in refrigerator for the South Portland Food Cupboard since they will have space for an additional fridge in their new location.
- ➤ We are planning to paint Bug Light the cost will be less if we do some of the prep work ourselves so be aware that you might see an email requesting a work party.
- Nicole reported that as part of our Hometown Heroes celebration at SpringFest (in which we will be awarding Paul Harris Fellows), retired SP City Clerk Linda Cohen has been added to the list of honorees, along with the SP & CE fire and police chiefs. (The other CE honoree, Jim Huebner, will be recognized at a later date due to a scheduling conflict.)
- The board voted to keep the club dues at the same level (\$200/year)
- ➤ We have a whopping 19 students going to RYLA this year 10 from CEHS and 9 from SPHS (ten is the maximum that we are allowed to send because the program does not permit multiple students from the same school being in the same group).
- ➤ We are looking into purchasing another Owl, much to the delight of Bill Lohrman and others who regularly attend meetings via Zoom.
- Our International Service Director Hannah will be resigning from the board at the end of this Rotary year due to time commitments with her new job (congratulations, Hannah!). Let Dan McDonald know if you have any interest in getting involved in the international activities that our club is involved in. And "international" also involves a lot of local service such as volunteering at Partners for World Health and all the Rotary Foundation activities our club is involved in.
- Also resigning from the board at the end of this Rotary year will be Sari, as she is a Florida resident now. Let Dan or Peter know if you have an interest in the Community Service area Sari will help with the transition.

<u>Guide to Global Grants</u> – Our speakers this week were Carolyn & Peter Johnson from the Yarmouth Rotary Club. Both of them are Past District Governors and they both have a LONG list of Rotary and community credentials, which Chris Speh recounted. They were at our meeting this week however to talk about Global Grants – Carolyn is our district's Global Grants Chair and incredibly knowledgeable about them. She also serves as the chair of The Rotary Foundation's "cadre" of experts in the field of education and literacy. She shared with us these characteristics of global grants:

- ❖ Must have strong Rotary leadership and involvement;
- Must be sustainable;
- Must have measurable results;
- ❖ Must align with one of Rotary's 7 Areas of Focus;

- ❖ Involves a partnership between two clubs in two countries: a host club where the project will take place and an international partner;
- ❖ Can be a humanitarian project, a vocational service team or support graduate studies;
- ❖ Must have a budget of at least \$30,000;
- ❖ Must be based on a community assessment of the community's needs;
- ❖ Are funded by a combination of money from one or more clubs, one or more districts (funds allocated to the district from The Rotary Foundation) and The Rotary Foundation's World Fund.

Carolyn's main piece of advice to anyone interested in applying for a global grant was to "read the rules!" She said that The Rotary Foundation <u>wants</u> to give away money for worthwhile projects so if you can come up with the funds and read the rules in applying for a grant, then you shouldn't have to worry about it being accepted.
