<u>Is Anybody Handy?</u> – Former member – but still our friend! – Kiley asked me to share this with the club:



<u>From One of Our Donee Organizations</u> – One of the organizations that our club supports is Greater Portland Family Promise, which provides transitional housing and other services to homeless families, many of whom are New Mainers. This is what one of them said in GPFP's yearend letter:

"Family Promise has made a difference in our lives. We were immediately welcomed into the shelter. We received emotional support, food, personal care products, bedding, clothes and shoes. Family Promise offered us a safe, loving environment. Staff spread love every day and gave us hope that better days would come for us here in America. In addition, we received help with public benefits, English classes, finding housing, furniture and household items."

Another Donee Organization, Partners for World Health – Thank you to our International Service Director Hannah for arranging for us to go to PWH on Tuesday and Thursday this week. Some of us were treated to an in-depth history of the organization and details of its operation by its founder Elizabeth McLellan. Since both Kathy and a friend of Bev's have been recipients of the PWH's Medical Supply Program and were quite enthusiastic about it, I thought I would mention this domestic aspect of the organization. In addition to sending surplus medical supplies and equipment overseas, PWH sells these supplies and equipment to people right here in Maine at a very reduced cost. They have a long list of items (and prices) on their website – things like thermometers, crutches, wheelchairs, oxygen masks, on and on. They are not a store, however, so interested individuals, organizations or businesses have to contact the Medical Supplies Coordinator to make a request. The PWH website states that the program, which is fairly new, has served 6,789 individuals to date. Here is the story of one of them (from their website).

Simon, 52, is a Portland resident who suffers from insulin dependent diabetes that has severely impacted his ability to live a full and rewarding life. He had daily seizures and multiple ER trips per week and lost his license to drive. He explained that he could not feel when his blood sugar was at a dangerous level and thus could not intervene with a dose of insulin. He was diagnosed as a teenager and battled this his whole life. His best solution was to receive a Dexcom which monitors his blood sugar for him and alerts him to dangerous levels. In order for MaineCare to pay for this he needed to be able to test his blood sugar 4 times a day for 30 consecutive days. MaineCare would only pay for test strips for 3x a day and he could not afford the extra 30 strips. In addition, testing 4x per day was difficult for Simon due to other issues. That's where PWH was asked to help. He received a Dexcom for no cost and was able to monitor his blood sugar for 30 consecutive days. Upon presenting this data to MaineCare, they subsequently agreed to pay for the Dexcom going forward.

Two years later, Simon has had no seizures, no ER visits, has his license to drive back, reports that he has his quality of life back in addition to being an engaged father to his 14-year-old son. By providing Simon with testing equipment and supplies from our Medical Supply Program (MSP) he has been able to manage his diabetes, engage in his other treatment protocols, and focus on building a better life with support from his community based social worker. Had Simon known of the MSP program earlier he could have accessed our supplies to help improve his health and it would have resulted in considerably less hospitalizations, visits to his PCP and other community impacts which likely cost the community around \$30,000 over the preceding six months.
