Happy New Year! – This was our new president Nancy Irving's first meeting as president and she presided over a presentation by the board members who were present about their goals for the upcoming year.



- Secretary Kathy Cotter reviewed the internal budget, 57% of which consists of the mandatory items of RI dues, district dues and insurance.
- Treasurer Marge Dugan reviewed the external budget. Our revenue this year will come primarily from two sources: the profit from last year's tree sale and the 2025 SpringFest. We participate in other fundraisers which do not provide significant revenue but they have social and/or community service benefits as well.
- President-Elect Peter Bennett said that he will be making sure that we continue to focus on implementing our strategic plan that came out of the 2023 visioning. He also wants to make sure everyone feels like they belong.
- Community Service Director Sari Greene distributed an AWESOME report describing 24 ways that we spent our Community Service budget in the past year, a very impressive recounting of how we make a difference in our communities. (She'll be sending it out to you so you can share with prospective members, sponsors, or just your family and friends who wonder why you're in Rotary.) In the current year, she wants to target three hands-on activities that the entire club could get involved in. Peter, Patty and Tom M volunteered to help plan these events.
- Club Service Director Bev Altenburg announced that in the current year, we will try to replace some of the speaker slots with meetings that involve a social aspect. Of course the lobsterbake and Sea Dogs game meet these criteria, and then in August (the 28th) we will be meeting at the Cape Elizabeth Historical Society at Fort Williams. Other suggestions include a holiday party, a bowling night and maybe even cornhole-in-the-classroom!
- Membership Director Brent Wilson announced that there will be a meeting for new members (less than two years) at his home on July 30 (see details in calendar above). Like Peter, he mentioned that keeping members engaged will be a priority.

Youth Services Director Ray Healey acknowledged that he'll be relying on help from his "lieutenants" Tony Wagner and John LoBosco, as well as on Kiley to bring him up to speed. He is especially interested in ways that our club can help students who are new Mainers.
