We will watch skits created by campers, pay tribute to the immense efforts of Rotary, and hear from Director Jacey and I as we recap the week and where to go from here. <u>Thank You New England Lighthouse Lovers!!</u> – Tony asked the organization for a grant to help with the cost of painting Bug Light and on June 11 the membership approved donating \$4,205 (half the contracted cost of \$8,410) towards the painting costs!

<u>South Portland Housing Authority Opportunity</u> – Brent asked me to pass on information about the new SPHA building at 101 Preble Street that is opening in July in case anyone reading this might know someone who would like this information. Rents for 1 Bedroom apartments will be \$1,332, with utilities and Wi-Fi included. Applicants must be 55 years of age or older. Brent will be happy to talk to anyone that might be interested.

<u>SpringFest Discussion</u> – Here are the observations that Anne recorded:

Many people came out, in spite of the rain.

Positives:

- Second year at Redbank was great; ice cream a big plus
- Giving out books to kids was great.

Ideas to improve:

- Should be a COMMITTEE, not just one or two people running it. Was too much stress on Jim Britt. But would enough people actually volunteer to be on committee?
- Get a couple of walkie-talkies.
- Have Redbank road race lead directly to other activities.
- Have more activities nearer the gazebo.
- Bring back Score-O.
- Have more garbage cans.
- Have a sign saying "Drop-off area" with traffic cones and orange neon vests.

It was also suggested that we speak with the City of South Portland and other partners to get their thoughts.

<u>And Foundation Football Discussion</u> – Here is how Anne summarized the discussion that took place during the June 11 meeting:

- There was a thoughtful discussion.
- Club members thanked Hannah for bringing up the issue.
- Why not look at/be open to other ideas?
- Some members prefer NO discussion on political issues.
- We apply the four-way test to ourselves, not to other organizations.
- Consensus at meeting: continue Foundation Football.

Tony Wagner said that he was there when this photo was taken so he was able to add some details:

- That is Bill York at the rental fryer on the left, the one that took about 1hour to set, level, fill, and start, usually with help from Yerxa.
- In the middle by the door is Alec Livingston imparting knowledge to Dave Smith and others, who would be headed inside the trailer to do the flouring and dough rolling.
- It is clear that this is BEFORE the dough rolling because when they came back out they were sweaty and WHITE all over.
- Rolling the dough (with rolling pins, not a machine) inside the tin can of a trailer in the summer was not a pleasant job hence the transition to the open air trailer we've been using for years and the purchase of a rolling machine!
- Note the importance of having a uniform at that time.
- Also note that if it rained, no canopy!
