He could not be present at SpringFest so at our meeting this week we awarded Paul Harris Fellow recognition to Cape Elizabeth resident **Jim Huebener**. There is a long list of the ways that Jim serves his community, the most recent being in his role as long-time coordinator of the CE Memorial Day parade.

<u>An Independent Judiciary</u> – Our speaker this week is well-known to us – Federal Judge Bill Kayatta, who happens to be Anne's husband. Chris introduced Bill by recounting his long list of accomplishments, which led to his being selected (and approved!) as a federal judge. Bill is one of six judges in the 1st Circuit Court of Appeals – that circuit consists of Maine, New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Puerto Rico. Bill explained the roles and interplay of the District Courts, Circuit Courts and Supreme Court and then he went on to explain the history and importance of an independent judiciary.

In 1761 and 1772 King George III issued two edicts which made the judiciary in the colonies subject to the king – i.e. he could fire them if he didn't like their decisions. In response to that one of the 27 complaints in the Declaration of Independence objects to that, and the Constitution makes it clear that the judiciary is not beholden to any other branch. It does that by providing lifetime tenure for judges, and by providing that the President or Congress cannot reduce a judge's salary if they disagree with a decision.

Bill explained that since the judiciary has no military or spending power, its ongoing independence is dependent on the will of the American people; a recent poll indicated that 79% of Americans believe that decisions of the courts should be binding. Bill observed that this is necessary in order to provide "liberty and justice for all."

Thank you Bill for this very timely and insightful presentation!
