
Congratulations to John LoBosco who drew his own raffle ticket number, resulting in a gift certificate to Red's from Bob Danielson.

Helping the South Portland Food Cupboard — Although it was previously announced that Sari would be leaving the club to join a club in Florida where she now lives, she is certainly no lame duck! Sari is working on a district grant application to purchase a walk-in cooler for the South Portland Food Cupboard at its new location. One of the criteria for district grants is that there be Rotarian participation. So Sari asked Tony to come up with an estimate of Rotarian hours spent volunteering at the SPFC. He came up with a staggering 2000 hours!! Proving that we don't just throw money at problems — we're in the trenches crossing out barcodes, driving the van to pick up food, collecting food at Sounds by the Sea, assisting with fundraisers and various other tasks. And unfortunately the need continues to grow — you may have seen the article in the Portland Press Herald last week. SPFC is on pace to serve families 7,000 times this fiscal year, a 65% increase over 3 years ago.

<u>Meet the New Town Manager</u> – Our speaker this week as new (since October) Cape Elizabeth town manager Patrick Fox. Pat grew up in South Portland and studied bioengineering at Wentworth Institute in Boston. He worked on the Big Dig before moving to Saco where he spent 20 years working for that city. Pat spoke about the Town Council's goals & initiatives:

- ✓ Engaged Citizens

He described a systematic way of managing the town's capital assets which are worth about \$170 million.

Neither of them were aware of this before meeting each other last fall but it turns out that Pat is related to former CE town manager Mike McGovern. Mike is in a unique position to evaluate Pat's performance: "he's doing an outstanding job."
