<u>Visit from Our District Governor</u> – This week was our "official" visit from District 7780 Governor Bob MacKenzie, whom I described in last week's bulletin. Bob shared a very personal story about the struggles with substance use disorder which 3 of his 5 children have faced, which is why he is so passionate about this topic. He was very enthusiastic about The Family Restored, Their mission is: "Believing recovery is possible, our mission is to strengthen and support families affected by addiction." They accomplish this by offering family support groups (150 families helped each week), 12-step recovery workshops and scholarships to help pay for treatment and recovery housing for those who cannot afford it (they have awarded 859 scholarships to date – over \$1 million). Our club has donated to this organization in the past and donated \$2,000 just two months ago.
