<u>Tree Sale Report</u> – Tree Sale Committee chair Matt reminded of the crucial dates for setup and delivery (see above) and assured us that SPHS student athletes will be available to help with the heavy lifting. He also reported that we're not re-inventing the wheel – the tree sale has gone very smoothly the past few years so no need to fix what ain't broken. Bill Gates & Dr. Peter Salk Hobnobbing – In the past couple week or so both Bill Gates and Dr. Peter Salk (son of Jonas Salk) had the privilege of being seen in company with our own Mike McGovern, Chair of RI's PolioPlus Committee. Mike was in Pittsburgh for World Polio Day last week and participated in a panel discussion that also included RI President Stephanie Urchick, Dor. Salk and RI Past President John Germ. From Baked Beans to Cutting Edge Technology – Our speaker this week was Margaret Angell, Head of Partnerships & Strategic Initiatives at the Roux Institute. Before speaking about Roux however, she shared with us how helpful our Rotary scholarship was to a high school student who used to babysit for her kids and is now a student at Connecticut College. Margaret described the formation of Roux by David Roux, who grew up in Lewiston and wanted to grow the technology sector in Maine so that kids wouldn't feel the need to move away in order to have careers in cutting edge fields. His aim was to create a world class institution of higher education in Maine that would integrate with existing educational institutions. In scouting around for a university to partner with, they landed on Northeastern, which has built a global university system and is one of the fastest growing research universities in the US. The Roux Institute focuses on graduate education, research and entrepreneurship. She noted that only 20% of their students take on debt because every student gets a scholarship from the Alfond Foundation. Most of us have heard of Roux in the new recently because they broke ground in September to build a campus at the site of the B&M Bake Beans factory. She said the Institute is well into the capital campaign to fund the construction.

<u>Preview of Coming Attractions</u> – Our speaker next week is the District Governor for our Rotary district (7780) Bob MacKenzie. In his day job Bob is the Chief of Police in Kennebunk, having risen through the ranks since joining them in 1988 to become Chief in 2008. He is a graduate of the 243rd FBI National Academy and has a BS in Criminal Justice from Husson University.

Bob's passion (along with Rotary of course) is supporting individuals who are suffering from substance use disorder. He chairs the district's Recovery Initiative Committee which just recently held its third annual Recovery Conference in September. It is customary for clubs to present a gift to the District Governor when he speaks to the club, so our club is making a donation to the Recovery Initiative Committee in his name.

District Governors are expected to visit and make a presentation to every club in the district, as well as to participate in planning district events and be on top of what's going on in the district. Which sounds like a full-time job in itself, and yet being police chief is also a very demanding full-time job. Let's try to have a good turnout on Wednesday to show Bob that we appreciate the Service Above Self he's displaying by serving as our District Governor!
