<u>September 11 Meeting</u> – Two weeks ago we met to hear what the board members have been up to. Here are some of the items that they reported on.

Care Committee – Club Administration Director Bev suggested that we form a "Care" Committee and Anne & Adrienne have stepped forward to co-chair that committee. If you know of someone within our club's extended family (including yourself) that has something going on for which reaching out to them would be appreciated, please let one of them know. Examples: illness, death in the family, births, etc. The committee will determine the appropriate way to respond on behalf of the club, whether it's a card, phone call, personal visit, etc. In addition the committee will be ensuring that we reach out in some way to our "Honorary Plus" members a few times a year. (Honorary plus means our honorary members PLUS members who are still active members but would be eligible to be honorary members.)

They have also put together a box of cards which will be available at meetings for members to take home if they want to send a personal card. We often have a card available at meetings for everyone to sign, and when signing it you may have thought "I ought to send a card myself also" but then you forget by the time you get home. This way you can grab a card out of the box to take home with you to make it so much easier to add your personal touch.

Membership Survey – Membership Director Brent and his committee are working on a survey to distribute to members and are hoping to get it out within the next month. Events in which Bug Light has been open have generated interest (including Jill Nadeau who was a guest this week!). The committee is also developing a mentorship program.
