Slants at the Meeting

The program last week was presented by the Vocational Service Committee; and Julius Feigelson and his committee called on Harry Marlow, Naval Architect at the Pennsylvania Shipyards, to talk on shipbuilding.

Mr. Average Citizen does not realize what a tremendous undertaking the building of a ship really is. Therefore, Harry's facts and figures were a revelation to most of us. Our speaker told us that there were more than a dozen C-1 type cargo vessels under construction at the Pennsylvania Yards at the present time. That the cost of one of the ships was \$2,500,000 and that the payroll on a single ship was some \$30,000 per week.

"Unlike a woman", said the speaker, "a ship must not be unpredictable. When we rig her we must know how the ship will perform under given conditions".

Harry pointed out the many opportunities the Sabine-Neches area has for industrial development in order to supply the shipyards with materials and services necessary to the building of ships. He said that the Gulf Coast was the logical place for shipbuilding after the war is over and well as for the duration".

We all know that Beaumont would have more industrial plants if we had enough fresh water to supply the mills. What! Not enough water? Well, we've had enough for a few days 'tis true. But we need the Rockland Dam to assure this section of enough fresh water to take care of new industries if we expect new industries to locate here. Let's get behind Barney Steinhagen and keep hollering 'till we get that Rockland Dam.

No, we didn't overlook the fact that Harry read his speech last week. But we know that Harry and the other architects, the engineers, and the layout men over at the shipyards are much too busy keeping work ahead of the men in the yards to take time out to learn speeches.
