# Last Week

The classification talks given by four new members last Wednesday went over big with the membership. Lee Griffin, program chairman, introduced them in order: E. C. McKinzie, General Merchandising, gave a forceful and interesting story of giant Sears-Roebuck which began when a large order of watches transported by rail was not accepted by a jeweler but sold by Railroader Sears instead of being returned to factory.

Bill Ott, Securities Brokerage, alert to an opportunity, stated he had not intended to mention his own firm, M.L.P.F. & B., but since McKinzie had made such a good talk, he would mention modestly that if any one was impressed sufficiently with the story to wish to buy Sears stock, he would be glad to take care of the orders.

Always timely and of interest in Beaumont is the subject of "Traffic". Dick Conley (Traffic Engineering) described his classification, as including planning and designing of streets, economic transportation of persons and goods aimed to eliminate accidents with three focal points: the driver, the vehicle and the roadway.

Dick Jenkins (Protestant Churches) says that a modern day pastor is expected to spend from 20 to 40 hours in preparation of his sermons, at least there

are some who wish he would. Added to that are the obvious jobs of baptizing infants, marrying sons and daughters, burying the dead; teaching Sunday School, guiding the youth; visiting the sick, those in sorrow or with special problems, a father confessor, if you desire. He is also an administrator of church monies held in sacred trust. A pastor's work is certainly Community Service; it has an International aspect; deals in Vocational Service and heavily in Youth Service.

There is a lot of talent in our own club and last week's program had a professional tinge. We liked it.

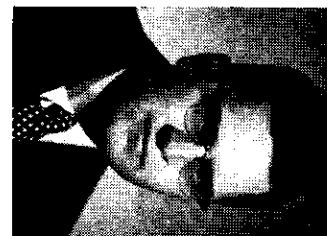
