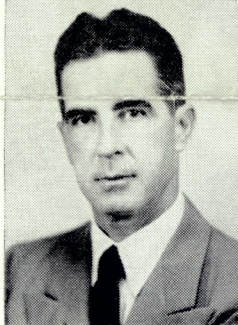
Program For This Wednesday

Nothing in the world, including talent, genius, and education, can take the place of persistence.

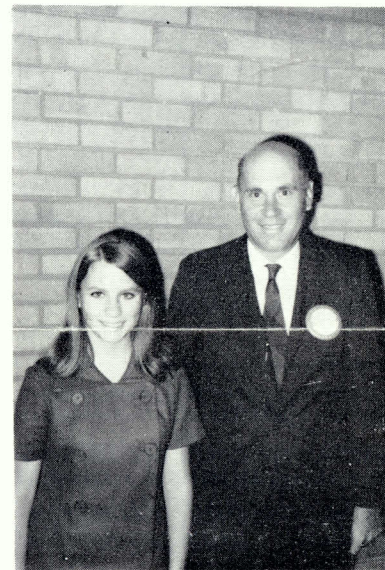
