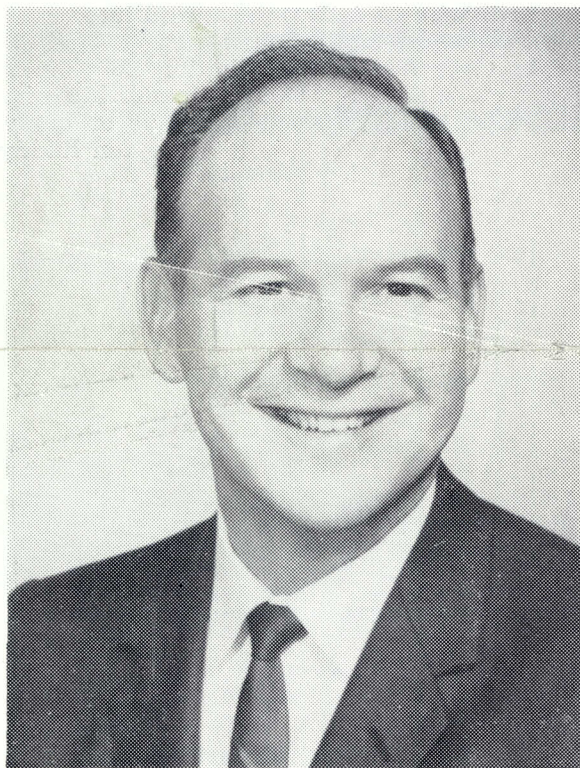




Program For This Wednesday

OUR 57TH ANNUAL CHRISTMAS LUNCHEON HONORING OUR ROTARYANNS BEAUMONT COUNTRY CLUB — 12:15 P.M.

Dr. B. Harrison Taylor, pastor of St. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, will deliver a Christmas Message at our 57th Annual Christmas Party. Mrs. Taylor will accompany Dr. Taylor, and Chairman Gene Ohmstede will introduce him.

Dr. Taylor is a native of Johnson City, Tennessee. He graduated from Davidson College in 1950 and from Columbia Theological Seminary with a Bachelor of Divinity Degree in 1954. He received his Master of Theology and Doctor of Theology Degrees from Union Theological Seminary in Richmond, Virginia. He has held pastorates in Jefferson City, Tennessee; served as Instructor in Bible and Chaplain at Lees-McCrae College, Banner Elk, N. C., and was Associate Pastor of First Presbyterian Church in Orlando, Florida before coming to Beaumont in 1967.

The Christmas Party traditionally is planned by the most recent Past Presidents, and this year Gene and June Ohmstede, J. O. and Addalee Croke, Bill and Nell Phillips, Alex and Marie Broussard, and Charles and Gloria Locke comprise our committee.

MEMORIAL RESOLUTION FOR T. KELSEY LAMB, SR.

On November 13, 1970, after a busy, interesting, successful and useful life, T. Kelsey Lamb, Sr., a member of the Rotary Club of Beaumont since 1928 and life-long resident of Beaumont, died at the age of 66 years.

The interests of this good and highly respected man were many and varied but they always were in organizations or efforts that were good for his community and his fellowmen. He was active in the affairs of his church — the Episcopal Church — at the local and state levels, having served at various times on the vestry of St. Mark's Church in Beaumont and as a senior warden and member of the executive board of the Texas Episcopal diocese.

A past president of the Beaumont Symphony Society and the immediate past president of the Beaumont Country Club, Kelsey Lamb had been active in such other worthwhile community organizations as the Little Theatre, the YMCA, the Chamber of Commerce and the Beaumont Community Chest and its successor, the United Appeals of Beaumont and North Jefferson County; but his interest in and service to Boy Scouts and Rotary were unusually strong and outstanding. It was during his presidency of the Trinity-Neches Boy Scout Council that Camp Umland was purchased by the Council and its development begun. In 1949 he was awarded the Silver Beaver, scouting's highest recognition of outstanding service by volunteer workers on the Council level, and in 1962 he was awarded the Silver Antelope, the highest Regional scouting award.

In Rotary, Kelsey Lamb had been chairman of practically every committee of the Beaumont Rotary Club when he was elected President for the 1942-43 year. He was elected to the Board of Directors 13 times and became Governor of Rotary District 190 in 1951. He served on numerous local, district and national committees of the organization. Quite appropriately, he was known as "Mr. Rotary" in Beaumont and Southeast Texas.

Thomas Kelsey Lamb, Sr., was a third generation Beaumont and of a family prominent in the business, civic and social affairs of this city for more than 90 years. He had a genuine compassion for unfortunate and underprivileged people and translated this compassion into helpful deeds performed in their behalf. He loved his friends dearly and was happy when he could do something for them. He will be greatly missed by his community, the organizations with which he was affiliated, and by many people of all ranks and stations who loved and admired him. Now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Rotary Club of Beaumont recognizes that in the death of T. Kelsey Lamb, Sr., it has lost a beloved and loyal member of the club who will be missed greatly in the days ahead, and

BE IT RESOLVED, that our club, the City of Beaumont, and Rotary International have benefited greatly as a result of the unselfish and devoted service rendered them by this outstanding Rotarian and citizen who believed strongly in the philosophy of service above self, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this Resolution be presented, with love and sympathy, to Kelsey's Rotaryann, Marian; to his sons, Thomas K. Lamb, Jr., and J. Payton Lamb; to his daughter, Mrs. Kathleen Lamb Boudreaux; and to his sister, Mrs. Kathleen Brittain; and that a copy be placed among the permanent records of the Rotary Club of Beaumont which T. Kelsey Lamb, Sr., served so well and loved so devotedly.

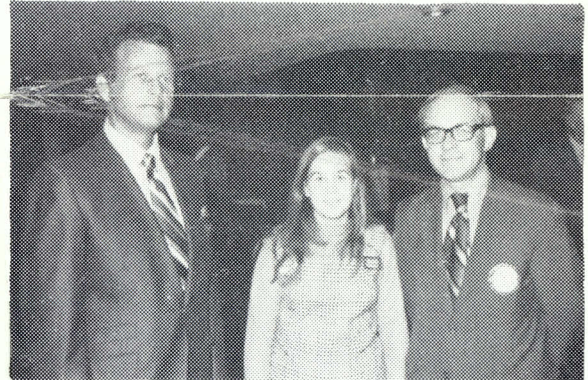
its people might follow to the rays of sunlight that await us on the far side of the maze of religious, social, and economic confusion that we have allowed to engulf us.
