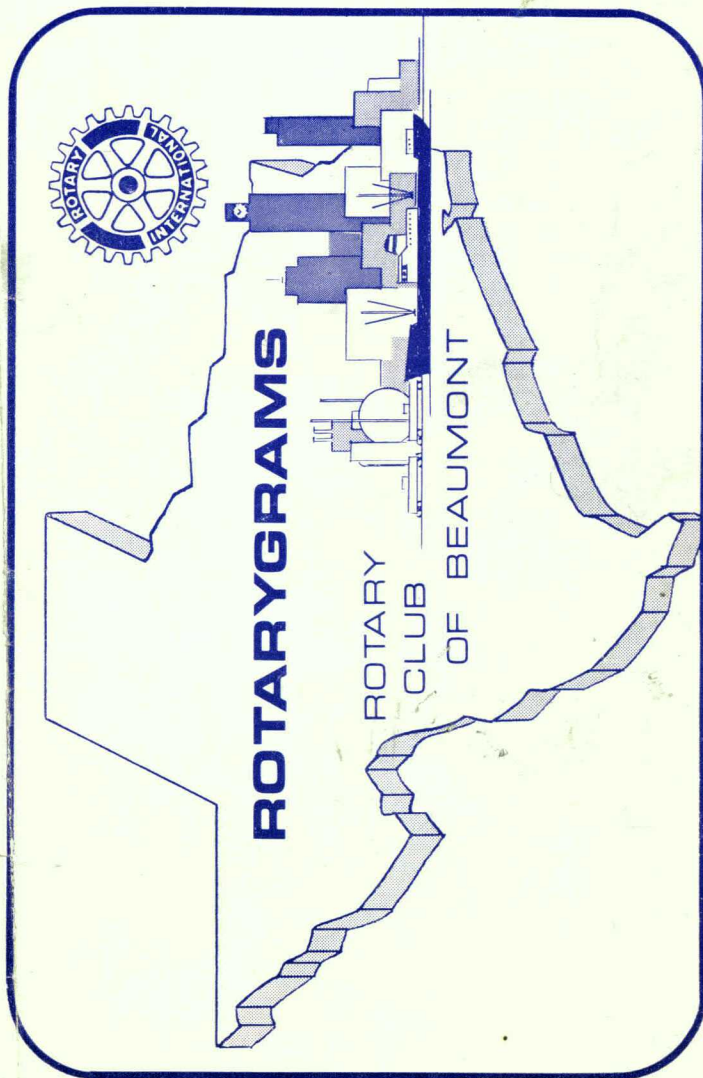

International Service

Henry B. Funchess, III, otherwise known as "Hank" heads up our International Service Lane this year. A native Beaumont, Hank graduated from Beaumont High School, then went to Texas A&M for his BBA degree, then the University of Houston for his MBA. Hank says he was in the Corps at A&M for two years; they told him his eyesight was going to keep him out for the last two. Uncle Sam evidently didn't agree with this because in 1956, after graduation from A&M, he received his "Greetings." His basic training in the U. S. Army Signal Corps was received at Fort Wood, and on to Fort Gordon, Georgia. He and his Rotaryann, Wanda, then had a little bit of luck; they were sent to Schofield Barracks in Honolulu. They had no little Funchesses at the time, and they lived on Waikiki. With the exception of a little interference by the Army, this proved to be a very nice two years for them.

After discharge, Hank came back to the University of Houston for his Master's Degree; moved back to Beaumont to become associated with Maschek, Hamby and Miller in 1959. In 1961 he passed his CPA exam and became a partner — thereby changing the name of the firm to include "Funchess."

"STOP AND THINK"

In May of 1919, at Dusseldorf, Germany, the Allied Forces obtained a copy of some of the "Communist Rules for Revolution." Nearly 52 years later, the Reds were still following them.

- A. Corrupt the young; get them away from religion. Get them interested in sex. Make them superficial; destroy their ruggedness.
- B. Get control of all means of publicity, thereby:
 - 1. Get people's minds off their government by focusing their attention on athletics, sexy books and plays and other trivialities.
 - 2. Divide the people into hostile groups by constantly harping on controversial matters of no importance.
 - 3. Destroy the people's faith in their natural leaders by holding the latter up to contempt, ridicule and disgrace.
 - 4. Always preach true democracy, but seize power as fast and as ruthlessly as possible.
 - 5. By encouraging government extravagance, destroy its credit, produce fear of inflation with rising prices and general discontent.
 - 6. Incite unnecessary strikes in vital industries; encourage civil disorders and foster a lenient and soft attitude on the part of government toward such disorders.
 - 7. By specious argument, cause the breakdown of the old moral virtues—honesty, sobriety, self-restraint, faith in the pledged word, ruggedness.
- C. Cause the registration of all firearms on some pretext, with a view to confiscating them and leaving the population helpless.

That is quite a list, isn't it? Now, stop to think — How many of these rules are being carried out in this nation today?

Tom Eagle's classification is Senior Active; so you know by this he certainly is no stranger to Rotary. He has been a Rotarian since 1946 in Parkville, Mo., North Kansas City, Mo. (serving as President of this Club for 2 years) and the Columbia, Mo., club. During this time he was District Governor of Rotary International for District 603.
