Program Review

Lamar's new Dean of the School of Business Henry Venta proved himself to be a brilliant speaker as well as a renowned scholar when he brought an ethics message to our club.

He used a recent ethics poll promulgated by Niagara University but analyzed the responses as if they had been guided by Rotary's Four-Way Test. As one example, is it unethical to leave out all negative elements of a student's performance when writing a letter of reference? Would that be fair to all concerned?

He pointed out that we need to know something about ethics, just as we need to know something about nutrition, in order to fully live our daily lives. He contrasted that with esoteric (but important) subjects like quantum mechanics, which we can successfully avoid thinking about throughout our lives without any negative impact.

Dean Venta also added humor to the day, commenting that he hoped his speech would help with his current application for membership in our club and that he felt his eclectic education would be a good excuse if his talk came across as disorganized.

All we Rotarians ask of our speakers is that they bring us a thoughtful, deep message, sprinkled with a few chuckles, and finish up before 1 PM. Dean Venta did all of that and more. We look forward to having him in our club.
