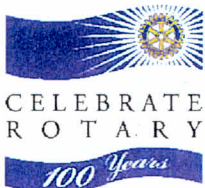

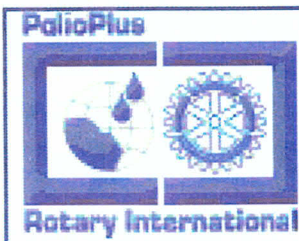

REVIEW

Earl Brickhouse introduced our feature speaker, Jesse Doiron, a native Beaumont, English Instructor at Lamar University and husband of **Uliana Trylowski**. He is also a victim of violent crime. Jesse presented "Restorative Justice," a victim's view of crime and punishment.

In 1983, Jesse was the victim of a brutal highway robbery. Two hitchhikers beat him with a three-pound shop hammer and left him for dead. He suffered a concussion, a detached spleen, a collapsed lung, several broken ribs, internal bleeding, and several other injuries.

In 2003, Jesse marked the 20th anniversary of this attack when he embarked on a personal journey of moral healing and forgiveness. Thus began the journey of "Restorative Justice" and ultimately "Restorative Peace." The principles of "Restorative Justice" are comparable to those of the Rotary "Four Way Test."

Jesse became involved with the "Bridges To Life" (BTL) project. BTL's primary mission is to connect communities to the prisons in an effort to reduce the recidivism rate of prisoners and thereby effect a consequent reduction in crime. The primary focus is on "Victim Impact" programs, which connect victims to offenders. Bridges To Life empowers victims and rehabilitates prisoners. BTL currently has 17 Bridges To Life Projects completed in 10 Texas prisons including one locally at the LeBlanc Unit.

BTL needs volunteers to help make a difference in the lives of both prison inmates and victims of crime. Upcoming projects are at the LeBlanc Unit starting June 4 and the following 11 Monday nights ending August 22. If interested please visit the website: www.bridgestolife.org. India has got sufficient vaccine. For the Polio NID we just want that our International Rotarian Friends should come to participate in Polio NID just to boost the morale and help physically in giving vaccine to children.

Do you know what is involved in the Polio immunization campaign in India? Here are some facts.....

- 1) 640,000 vaccination booths.
- 2) 2.3 million vaccinators.
- 3) 1.1 million vaccination teams.
- 4) 137,000 supervisors, with 137,000 vehicles (cars, motorcycles, mopeds, bicycles, boats, elephants, camels or whatever it takes).
- 5) 200 million doses of Polio Vaccine, carried around the country in 2 million vaccine carrier bags.
- 6) 6.3 million Ice packs to keep all
