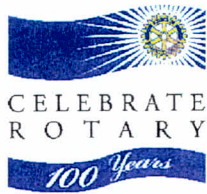

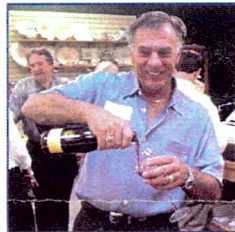
Youth Service Awards

Program Review

Carole Reeves introduced our featured speaker, Marvin Reeves. Carole gave our speaker glowing accolades. Coincidentally, Marvin is Carole's husband.

Marvin along with his partner Syed "Mo" Mohiuddin started the Safe Kids Card organization in this area. A Safe Kids Card is an all-in-one digital identification card. The card is an actual mini CD-ROM slightly larger than a credit card. The card contains three digital images of the child, digital fingerprint and all personal/medical information.

In an emergency, the card contains all pertinent information already formatted for an Amber Alert to be handed over to law enforcement. This information can be emailed or printed quickly. Even in a medical emergency, the card can be given to hospital staff to review medical conditions, allergies, etc. Every second counts when a child is missing or injured. The card is a stand-alone. No permanent database of the children's informa-

tion is maintained within the Safe Kids Card system.

Marvin's and Mo's goal is that every child in Jefferson County will have a Safe Kids Card. The program needs assistance from the community. Those in greatest need are underprivileged children in our county. Several community programs are assisting with this project; however, the project needs additional assistance to attain its goal. For additional information, please contact Marvin.

The cost of the card is \$20 for the Basic ID (\$13 for the ID and \$7 for the duplicate). The cost of the Complete ID is \$25 (\$16 for the ID and \$9 for the duplicate). The difference is the Complete ID contains parental and guardian information that the Basic ID does not.

Our thanks go to Carole for arranging the program and to Marvin and Mo for informing us about a vital program available to our community. Our children are our future.
