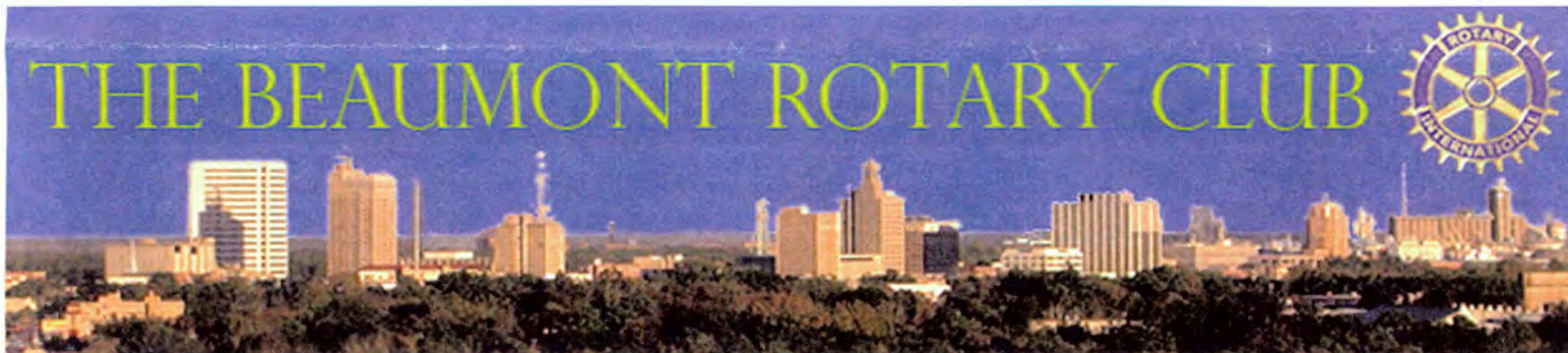

REVIEW

There is that word again!

Last week Club members were reminded of the objective of Rotary and its members – the Ideal of Service. Our very own “Mr. Rotary”, **Alex Broussard** shared the perspective of another Rotarian entitled “What does a Rotary Club Do?” (reprinted below). We will not soon forget that Rotary is more than “meet, greet, take a seat and eat”!

President-Elect **Angela Baker** introduced next year’s Rotary International theme – ROTARY SHARES. Only Angela would begin her remarks with “after learning what today’s program was about, I wondered if the membership would impeach me before installing me as president?” Angela reinforced Rotary’s philosophy of service – SERVICE ABOVE SELF – which is based on the principle that “he (or she) profits most who serves best.” That word again! In Angela’s words “everyone has a gift and Rotary gives us the opportunity to put into action what you believe your gift is. The Rotary Club of Beaumont is the 60th LARGEST of 32,000 clubs worldwide. Do we do everything we can to serve locally, statewide, internationally as the world’s 60th largest club?” That word again... service!

After Lane Chairs and Committee Chairs were introduced, club members were asked to select (i.e. sign our names in permanent ink) our committee preference sheets for the 2007-2008 year. Before you ask yourself how many scooters headed out the door, VERY FEW.

It is not too late to get on the ROTARY SHARES bandwagon in 2007-2008. This coming year promises to be action-packed with the membership demonstrating Rotary’s objective: Service Above Self. Bet we will hear “that word again” from President-elect Angela, the board members and committee chairs. Count on it!
