Carol Flatten educated many of us today about the Foundation for Southeast Texas. This is a 501 © (3) non profit organization. The Foundation was established in 1996; the Foundation manages, invests and administers funds given by many donors for numerous charitable purposes. Funds are given to the organization in numerous ways. The Foundation can accept endowments, donor-advised funds or unrestricted funds. You can also donate real property, insurance and retirement funds. Often, donors will give a gift as a memorial or honorarium. The funds are used for numerous community needs such as building community assets, giving educational or play camp scholarships as well as granting the needs of social services for appliances, computers and repair of real property. The funds often give to other non profit organizations such as Habitat for Humanity, United Way, CASA and the Southeast Texas Arts Council.

The organization has gone through a metamorphous after Hurricane Rita. Their building was destroyed from losing their roof and experiencing rain and mold damage. The location has been rebuilt through the use of insurance, and various grant money to fill the GAP funding accounts where insurance left off.
