Program Review 9-15-10

Chelsea Tipton is the music director for the Symphony of Southeast Texas and beginning his second year as its maestro. He spoke to the club about how a conductor empowers an orchestra to play as a single cohesive unit. An orchestra has four main parts: woodwinds, brass, percussion and strings. It takes leadership and a willingness to follow in order for all of the individual parts to play as a whole. An orchestra must work together on timing, rhythm, music, history of the music, etc. Chelsea taught us the six characteristics that it takes for an orchestra (or business or other organization) to achieve success.

- 1. Clear understanding of the goal***
- 2. Competent people - participants or employees must have good training.***
- 3. Exhibit a high level of trust***
- 4. Possess effective negotiating skills***
- 5. Possess leadership skills - people must have competent guidance***
- 6. Internal and external support - a sufficient number of qualified staff and/or assistants must be present.***

From Maestro Tipton's perspective, the teamwork involved in all successful organizations is the same as the teamwork required for an orchestra. Russ Schultz introduced the speaker. The first concert will be Saturday, September 25, 2010 at the Julie Rogers Theatre. It starts at 7:30 p.m. but Maestro Chelsea Tipton will begin his lecture at 6:30 p.m. Brian Shook will perform as a soloist on the trumpet.
