Some of the guests shared their reactions after participating in the event:

Gene Arnold was a great host! Good food and fellowship. Gene taught us that you really can park your car IN your office, literally! We also learned a great deal about the use of lime in gold mining. Just ask Gene, he's mining lime in Peru that is then sold to local gold mining companies to neutralize the acid residue from gold mining. And if you need a really nice office space to rent, see Gene - he's got a couple available.

Chad Blanchard treated us to a delicious fajita lunch and an entertaining history of Munro's Dry Cleaning, in business in Beaumont since the 1920's. I learned that in addition to commercial dry cleaning for individuals and businesses, Munro's also sells safety apparel. If you are in the market for safety apparel, for \$116 you can buy a pair of fire resistant overalls that will last 4 or 5 years. Chad Blanchard also reported on Munro's expansion along the Gulf Coast all the way to Corpus Christi!

The Mall was fantastic. We learned a lot about Parkdale Mall:

11 million shoppers/year at Parkdale.

- · There is a plan to alleviate the traffic issues .
- · Parkdale is 90% occupied.
- · Sales are good this year.
- Parkdale will generate revenue of \$330-335/square foot by year end. (Galleria in Houston
 is probably \$500-\$600/square foot which is why they have Coach, Nordstom's, etc.)
 Parkdale is a big mall in a small market.
- 14 new stores being added.
- Building a new AT&T building in front of Marshalls.

We had a very nice time at the Beaumont Enterprise. Bill Offill, Publisher, and Tim Kelley, Editor, talked with our group about the newspaper business, about the changing realities and the switch to online publishing and the future of newspapers. Both Bill and Tim felt that their reach in the community has grown considerably since moving toward the Enews and twitter and FaceBook, etc.

We had a tour of the building, which included the warehouse where the carriers come in and fold and bag the papers (at 2:00 in the morning!), and we also saw the old presses that are no longer functional. Today, the Enterprise is printed in Houston and delivered to Beaumont. The presses stopped working after lke, and they are now like a "museum piece." They are very impressive and formidable. Two stories of machines, it must have been quite a sight to see them running.

Robert Turner asked Bill if he'd ever had a "stop the press!" moment, and Bill shared that the closest he came to that, in Houston in 2008, was to say "don't stop the presses, keep printing extra copies," when he realized how popular and demanded the issue was that declared Obama winning the presidency. People were lining up at the newspaper's building to buy copies for mementos. They had to print extra copies that day because all the stores were selling out.
