"Mr. Lincoln Comes Home!"



T. Tolbert Chisum Former CEO and Vice Chairman The Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation Managing Director of Business Development Wintrust Financial

Tolbert Chisum grew up in Sour Lake, Texas, graduated from Sam Houston State University and began a career with Aetna. After about 30 years, he found himself President of the Winnetka branch of North Shore Community Bank and Trust. He was founder, Board memember and a branch President of North Shore Communicty Bank and Trsut Company in Winnetka. Currently, he is managing director of business development with Wintrust Financial and Executive Vice President of The Chicago Trust Company.

It was because of his experience and reputation in finance that he was asked to negotiate an agreement to purchase an extensive collection of Lincoln artifacts for the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation in Springfield, III. "The largest private collection in the world of Lincoln items, artifacts and documents was owned by renowned Lincoln scholar and collector Louise Taper of Beverly Hills, California. Her collection contained Lincoln's most famous stovepipe hat that he wore every day, the blood-stained gloves he wore the night he was shot, the clock from his law office in Springfield, his wallet and spectacles, and approximately 1,200 other items and documents," Chisum said. He successfully negotiated the purchase and these treasured pieces of American history are now in the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library in Springfield, IL.

It is appropriate that the lead project of our Centennial International Service focus is the club favorite of layettes for Nicaragua. Chairman Sharon McCabe and her able committee have acquired all the necessary items to fill the bags, purchased the bags, and are planning an evening for club members to work together to assemble the 100 bags to be shipped to Nicaragua.

Jim Kite, founding director of Hope and Relief Foundation, was keynote luncheon speaker to our club and the delegates of the Large Club Conference and spoke about the very successful layette project, in which our club has been involved, that serves pregnant women in Nicaragua who were found waiting in parks outside of the hospital to have their babies. The layette project grew out of Hope and Relief Foundation's efforts to establish a maternity waiting house. The layette bags provide necessary goods to care properly for their newborns. By providing this type of care, the group is able to ensure that the newborn children are properly cared for, that the infant mortality rate has declined to zero in that particular area, and that the children later go to schools and become selfsustaining and contributing members of the communities.


