

"Mr. Lincoln Comes Home"

Vice Chairman of the

Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation

Rotary Speaker for February 13, 2013, was Tolbert Chisum, former CEO and Vice Chaiman of Foundation, in Springfield, Illinois. Mr. Chisum grew up in Sour Lake, Texas, and is a member of our Rotary Club. He was introduced by Judy Kelfstrom, Regional Resources Development Director, of the Salvation Army-Texas Division. Currently, Tolberte is Managing Director of Business Development with Wintrust Financial and Executive Vice President of The Chicago Trust

Company. He currently serves as Vice Chairman of the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation.

Entitled "Mr. Lincoln Comes Home," Mr. Chisum spoke about many aspects of the Lincoln Presidential Library, and the Abraham Lincoln Museum. Tolbert was recruited by the wife of former Governor Ryan of Illinois to develop fundraisers in order to obtain items related to and used by Abraham Lincoln, as the Abraham Lincoln Museum neared completion (2007). This museum is twice as large as any other Presidential Museum.

Tolbert shared stories and pictures of the items in the Lincoln Collection that he purchased for the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library. There are presently over 66,000 items, including personal items, documents, the original Emancipation Proclamation, an ax with which Abe entertained wounded soldiers, and his signature stove-pipe hat! Many of these items have been purchased from or donated by Louise Taper, who, at one time, owned the largest collection of 'all things Lincoln.'

The original Emancipation Proclamation was signed by President Lincoln in 1863, three times: one for the central United States, one for the west coast, and one for the east coast.

Tolbert recommended seeing the recently released historical film, "Lincoln." The major film was based on the book "Team of Rivals: The Political Genius of Abraham Lincoln" by Doris Kearns Goodwin. It was produced by Kathleen Kennedy and directed by Steven Spielberg. Tony Kushner provided the screenplay. Doris Kearns Goodwin has been and is a current member of the Board of Directors for the Abraham Lincoln Presidential Library Foundation.
