

## PROGRAM PREVIEW February 20, 2013

## "Texas Ranger Border Operations"

Kevin Pullen is a Lieutenant in Company A with the Texas Rangers. He is a  $3^{rd}$  generation lawman and his sons are also currently serving in law enforcement. Texas Rangers were founded in 1823 as a law enforcement agency with jurisdiction across Texas and 150 serve over 200 counties in the state.

In 2006, the police along the Texas-Mexico border contacted Governor Rick Perry to discuss 'spillover' violence. This is the violence created by cartels that spills over from Mexico to the U.S. and was effecting the border area citizens. The crimes consisted of murder, drug and human trafficking and illegal weapons distribution. As a result of this violence and in an effort to curb it, Operation Border Star was born.

Operation Border Star is an ongoing multi-agency operation that places Texas Rangers and local law enforcement together to work to minimize the spillover violence from Mexico. Funding is provided by the state and is used to develop and provide better weapons with sophisticated optics. It also allows the enforcers to train with military and SWAT advance training teams. Weapons used include a .223 Bushmaster, .308 assault rifle and drones. New tactics, additional personnel, and modern equipment have helped minimize the drug cartels' foothold along the Texas border. However, the border war continues.
