PROGRAM PREVIEW January 16, 2013

"The Texas Criminal Justice System: Success or Failure"



Larry Gist Senior Criminal District Judge

After years of judicial service in Jefferson County, Judge Larry Gist almost needs no introduction. He is well-known as a firm, fair judge and is eagerly welcomed back as a Rotary speaker. Judge Gist will discuss the current status of the Texas criminal justice system with emphasis on prisons, parole and probation as well as the programs and policies that have been either successful or a failure.

Judge Gist graduated from the University of Notre Dame and the University of Texas Law School. In addition, he graduated from the National and Texas Judicial Colleges; the College of Advanced Judicial Studies and is a member of the College of the State Bar of Texas.

He served for 9 years as an Assistant Criminal District Attorney of Jefferson County; 1 year as Assistant State's Attorney before the Texas Court of Criminal Appeals; and 20 years as Criminal District Judge of Jefferson County. He has continued to serve as a full time Senior Criminal District Judge for the last 18 years in the Jefferson County Drug Impact Court.

He has received numerous awards and recognitions during his 47 year legal career, and the first Texas State Jail Prison was named after him by the Texas Board of Criminal Justice. He has served on numerous committees and commissions devoted to the improvement of criminal law

Jo Anne Settles District Polio Plus Committee

Our speaker today, for Rotary, was Jo Anne Settles, District Polio Plus Committee Chairman. Mrs. Settles was introduced by Chuck Mason. Both Jo Anne and her husband, Billy, have been active in Rotary's Polio Plus program for years. Jo Anne has spoken to many Rotarian and non-Rotarian groups about Rotary's Polio Eradication efforts, using her nursing background to help listeners better understand both the medical and humanitarian issues involved.

Jo Anne used a Power Point presentation, "Polio: I Thought It Was Gone" to illustrate her talk. We learned the polio virus has ONE and ONLY ONE host or reservoir: the human gut! Polio is a virus that is only transmitted via the 'fecal-oral' route. Poor sanitation can contribute to transmission but the virus does not replicate anywhere other than the human intestine.

Important dates: The Polio outbreak of the early 1950s struck terror in the hearts of everyone! In 1952, there were at least 558,000 reported case in the United States of America.

In 1952, Jonas Salk created the original vaccine.

In 1977, the US had its last reported case of Smallpox.

In 1977, the US had its laste reported case of Polio.

In 1979, there was a Polio outbreak, in the Phillipines. They promptly received a grant via 3-H that helped eradicate polio in the Phillipines.

Polio Plus is partnered with the following:

- WHO World Health Organization
- CDC --- Center for Disease Control (and Prevention)
- UNICEF
- Bill Gates Foundation

There are only THREE countries that presently have reported cases of Polio:

- Afghanistan = 35 cases
- Pakistan = 58 cases
- Nigeria = 119 cases
- Non-endemic Countries = 6

With the help of Rotary, Rotarians, and our partner organizations, 429,000,000 children received the Polio vaccine in 2012. The newest vaccine is called "Bi-valent Vaccine." Governments have a way of becoming barriers to life-saving medicines/procedures but Rotarians continue to take a stand and shout "ENOUGH."

Jo Anne's message was so passionately delivered, listeners' hearts pounded with compassion. When she gave the opportunity, the roomful of attentive participants eagerly voiced their agreement affirming "enough." At other times, the only sound in the room other than her voice was sniffs as tears filled the eyes of many. There was no doubting her contagious passion as she moved the audience to their feet for a standing ovation.
