Guest Speaker this week is someone all football fans know: Mr. First Down, Red Cashion!

Cashion is known by NFL players, coaches, and fans for his signature first down call in which he would enthusiastically drawl "First downwwwn!" out to the crowd. In a 1997 interview with *The Sporting News*, he said, "I don't know of any time that started it or stopped it. It was just something that sort of evolved and been there ever since". Cashion's promotion to referee came just one season after the NFL began equipping referees with wireless microphones to explain penalty calls and complex rulings to fans in the stadium, members of the media, and the television audience at home.

Cashion was inducted into the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in 1999. He also provided the voice of the referee for several versions of the Madden NFL video game."



Fellow Rotarian and Mayor Becky Ames gave the club an overview of how the City has been performing in the last several years. On finance issues, the City has been fortunate to be in a very good financial position and the valuation tax rate in the city has actually been lowered. In comparison to other cities in Texas of the same size, Beaumont has stabilized its taxation rate and it is one of the lowest rates. The city has lived within its means under a good team of our City Manager and CFO.

Regarding the \$54 million in oil and gas revenues from the City Airport, Beaumont was successful in receiving a federal exception to spending in areas other than the airport. About \$50 million will be spent on transportation for the city with refurbishing of city streets: Washington, Magnolia, Old Dowlen Road and 7th Street.

Funds received from Tyrrell Park oil and gas revenues will be spent in the ratio of 75% to the Park and the remaining 25% going to the Tyrrell Library. Those funds are approximately one half million dollars.

The Calder Street project has been complete with a cost of approximately \$65 million dollars. Most of those funds were from FEMA.

The City has also been replacing our aging infrastructure of sewers (over 50% has been replaced in the last ten years). Our water capacity has been increased from 27 to 40 million gallons per day.

The city has entered into a new agreement with a company to convert 35 to 40% of our land fill to fuel that will pay the city about \$400,000 to do so.

Bright spots of the community include the Event Center, Lunch on the Lake program, Children's Museum and, of course, the Rotary Playground. The Miller Library renovation is complete. The City 311 line for information has been successful. The AMTRAK station has been completed and a police substation is on the site. And American Airlines seems to be gaining in popularity at the airport.

"It's another great day in Beaumont."
