



**PROGRAM REVIEW** June 12, 2013 "On Being an NFL Referee"

#### Mason "Red" Cashion NFL Referee by Rotarian John Neely

Rotary speaker today was Red Cashion, 25-year referee of the National Football League. Red was introduced by Dr. David Teuscher.

Known by all football fans as "Mister First Down," Dr. Teuscher introduced Cashion and showed a "YouTube" clip of Red exclaiming that key phrase in a game and the announcer's reaction.

Ref Cashion took the microphone and talked a bit about his 1st year as a "rookie referee." He earned lots of laughs while starting his presentation with colorful expletives about names he had been called.

When film was reviewed by the team of referees, it took place in the hotel room of the "rookie ref." The Team would invade the rookie's hotel room, take the bed sheet off the bed, and tack it up on the wall (as a screen) with tacks that the rookie had to carry.

Red shared some wonderful stories and experiences about life as an NFL referee. Red said the biggest challenge for officials is to remember that they are NOT there to watch and enjoy the game.

There's always been differing opinions about the quality of officiating (probably in every sport), with introduction of color television, after black & white, instant replay, rule changes and most recently: "high definition" television. In the final analysis, the guys in "striped-shirts" really don't make as many mistakes as many a fan would swear to. Out of approximately 2,200 opportunities to "make a call" each game, the refs get it right 95% of the time. He also stated that the "learning curve" for a rookie referee is about 3 years.

During a game in Denver, the referees were debating whether to wear long-sleeve shirts or short-sleeve shirts. They decided to wear long-sleeved because it might get cooler after the sun went down. It proceeded to snow six inches in the second half. Later that same game, Red called a 15-yard penalty on a player that had been eyeballing him. The player grabbed an opposing player and whacked him on the head. After assessing the penalty, Red was asked by the player, "Why didn't you throw me out of the game?" Red replied, "If I have to play in THIS weather, so do you!"

Red informed the audience that whenever a referee comes to the middle of the field, it's not to inform the crowd as much as it is to inform the commentator, "that former Jock, in the announcers booth, of rules that the Jock never learned while they were playing."

The most wonderful player that Red ever met was Walter Payton. Walter trained 364 days a year, which is probably why he was seldom injured. Red remembered a game - Detroit vs. Chicago - and the clock was winding down with Chicago up by two points.

It was 3rd and 2, and Walter was their best bet for the 1st down. Detroit players swamped him, and while on the bottom of the "pile-up," Red noticed a black hand reach out from the bottom of the pile to 'undo' Red's shoelaces (Walter.)
