

A maximum of 42, nominated participants work closely within a small group to develop and present one of the monthly seminars. Topics to be studied by each Leadership Beaumont class depend on the challenges or issues confronting the community at the time. In the past, classes have examined such subjects as crime, local government, quality of life, economic development, ethnic diversity, infrastructure, and education.

PROGRAM PREVIEW March 13, 2013

"The TransCanada Keystone Pipeline Project"



James "Jim" Prescott **Senior Consultant** by Rotarian John Neely

Today's speaker for Rotary was James Prescott, Senior Consultant for the Keystone Pipeline Project, headquartered in Alberta, Canada. Mr. Prescott was introduced by Vernon Pierce.

Jim talked to Rotarians about the wealth of experience that Keystone 'brings to the table' as they continue to help improve America's ability to be less dependent on foreign countries for our energy-needs. Keystone covers 34 states, 7 provinces, and is headquartered in Houston, Texas.

Keystone is Canada's largest private-sector power generator with a 2149-mile pipeline system that starts in Hardisty, Alberta, Canada, travels to Cushing, Oklahoma and Wood River, Illinois. This pipeline-platform

> enables the safe and efficient movement for transporting products which are extracted from oil-sands growth and shale-oil growth. In addition, this "platform" allows Keystone to better connect to new markets.

As an FYI, North Dakota has replaced Alaska as the 2nd largest oil-producing state - second, of course, to

The Keystone Project has come up against some political and environmental restrictions but appears to have met and overcome most of those resistances with ethical, responsible and accurate data, analysis, and facts. This brings us to the Gulf Coast Project.

Connecting pipeline from Cushing, Oklahoma to Nederland, Texas will cost \$ 2.3 billion. This project will result in 4,000 NEW JOBS: 3,000 pipeline jobs and 1,000 facility jobs.

The Gulf Coast Project will accomplish the following:

- relieve the glut of oil stored in Cushing, Oklahoma;
- transport the supplies of U.S. crude oil to meet the growing demands (Texas); and,
- reduce the U.S dependence on foreign oil.

The U.S. imports 8 to 9 million barrels of oil EACH DAY. Consumption runs at 18.5 million barrels EACH DAY!

An additional benefit to our region will be the local revenues that will come into our communities, estimated at of over \$2.5 million for necessities, as well as an additional \$2.5 million on personal purchases! That is not even mentioning the billions that this project will generate in tax-revenues. Overall, it sounds like the Gulf Coast Project is an excellent investment IN the U.S. and FOR the U.S.
