

A case of type 1 polio has been reported in the Banadir region of Somalia, the country's first case since March 2007. In response to the outbreak, an immunization campaign was scheduled, aimed at reaching more than 350,000 children in the Banadir region.

The World Health Organization (WHO) has issued a surveillance alert for Somalia and bordering areas of northern Kenya and eastern Éthiopia, highlighting the need for urgent searches for additional cases of acute flaccid paralysis and suspected polio in all health facilities.

While only three countries remain polio-endemic -- Nigeria, Pakistan, and Afghanistan -- the world is at risk of outbreaks until all three stop the virus. Continued support for polio eradication is needed to ensure that the progress gained is not lost.

Spindletop Salt Domes and Liquid Natural Gas



Robert Cornell Operations Manager Golden Triangle Storage/AGL

Robert Cornell from Golden Triangle Storage (GTS) discussed liquified natural gas storage at the Spindletop Salt Domes.

- -Original Gladys City oil wells were actually in residents' backyards.
- -GTS drills into the salt caverns to store liquified natural gas.
- -The storage wells need distribution channels and pumps. These pumps can pump over 700 gallons per minute. The monthly electric bill is approximately \$250,000.
- -Mr. Cornell described the process of cleaning out each dome for storage.
- -To contain the storage well in the salt layer, a nitrogen pack or some type of cap is applied to the top of the
- -Each well is similar to a large Coke bottle in its pressurization process.
- -Mr. Cornell showed a map of the GTS footprint in Southeast Texas, which utilizes over nine miles of pipe.
- -Salt domes have been used for liquified natural gas storage for over 100 years in Europe.
- -GTS hopes to be involved with the Golden Pass project, and is well positioned to help because of the more current nature of GTS' technologies and resources.
