Bottle 1 comes from the Bernhardt Winery in Plantersville, TX, and is an Estate Blanc Du Bois. A taste of home! Its bellowing aromas of honey, fruit and flowers fill the glass beckoning you to indulge! This is a lightly dry wine made from grapes grown in our vineyard. This is the first commercially produced wine ever made in Grimes County! It was an award winner 2010 and is valued at almost \$40.

Bottle 2 comes from the Haak Winery and Vineyards in Santa Fe, TX, and is a 2005

Madeira Jacquez. Haak Vintage Madeira is made with 100% Jacquez grapes, grown in the Gulf Coast Region of Texas. It is made using the traditional "Estufagem" (es too FAH jem) process, where the barrels of wine have been "madeirized" in a special, heated cellar. The temperatures of the wine in the Estufagem average between 102°F to 106°F. Haak Winery's Estufa was completed in early 2006, and is one of very few in the United States today. Haak Vintage Madeira is the first and only commercial Madeira made and bottled in the state of Texas. It has a deep, caramel color, as well as aromas of coffee, caramel, walnuts and plums. These flavors are rich and balanced, with a long, sumptuous finish on the palate. It is valued at almost \$20 a bottle.



Afghanistan's ambassador to the United Nations, Zahir Tanin, spoke at an End Polio Now dinner in Arlington in August. Vice Consul Jagdeep Kapoor, of the Consulate General of India in Houston, also attended the event, which featured a presentation on the Global Polio Eradication Initiative and drew 82 Rotarians and guests, raising \$26,500 for PolioPlus.

The following night, the Rotarians sponsored an End Polio Now event at a Texas Rangers baseball game with the Minnesota Twins. The event began with a pregame party outside the ballpark, which netted \$2,350 through the sales of food and beverages donated by local businesses.

PROGRAM REVIEW September 26, 2012 "Our Trip to Nicaragua"

Vernon Pierce introduced PDG Roger McCabe, along with his wife Sharon, and Brett Bertles from the Lamar Rotaract Club who visited Nicaragua, along with a number of other Rotaract members, in July 2012 for about five days.

The primary purpose of the trip was to visit and help with the Chinendega Dump. One of the primary Rotary projects is assistance with education of the children who live and work at this dump site. Brett mentioned to the club that it is a very emotional experience to watch these people clear the trash off of trucks that come to the dump. The people pull the trash off in an effort to find materials to use, sell, or develop housing structures. This process occurs regularly at the dump, and all of the materials the people use to live comes from the trash trucks.

In 2003, Rotary built a school to help educate the children in an effort to change the lifestyle of future generations. The school serves about 800 students. The principal makes about \$200 per month. The group showed photos of the school, a fully furnished building that even includes a computer lab. The students wear uniforms, and PDG

McCabe indicated that the students are all happy, polite, and a pleasure to be around. He also showed photos of some of the successful graduates from the school. The students even participate in trade school activities for half of the day, following regular classroom instruction, to learn to build and sell new items.

The campus also houses a dialysis center, and a small hospital. Doctors visit the campus frequently, providing regular, and much needed, medical services. The school has a music school. Brett discussed the beaded bracelet making workshop and process. Beaded bracelets have been sold to our club in past years as a fundraiser for Rotary's support of these children. Brett also discussed minor process improvements that have helped the bead makers work faster and more efficiently; evidence of the quality education the students are receiving.

PDG McCabe discussed the process of building small homes for residents in the area. Homes are deeded to the female head of the family because the men were deemed undependable for ensuring that the homes will be kept and used for the shelter of the children.

The process of assisting the residents in establishing farming businesses involves a loan that must be repaid. The idea is to ensure sustainability by teaching residents how to efficiently run a business, rather than to only receive handouts. PDG McCabe showed photos of the delivery and use of the Layette bags assembled and donated by our club. He also emphasized the residents' pride in Rotary's support if their growth and development. Brett reiterated that this process is not about charity; it's about changing lives.

Bracelets were sold after the meeting concluded and more can be purchased through the McCabes.
