Mike is currently volunteering as the Director of the Neches River Adventure Project for the Big Thicket Association.

Mike is Founding Director of the Nature Classroom Project, and founding and current Director of the DuPont Science SuperStars program which is said to have impacted more than 30,000 elementary students in its initial seven years of operation.

Mike is well-known as the Founding Director of Shangri La Botanical Gardens and Nature Center and was a science teacher at all levels of the educational system for 29 years. He was awarded the Presidential Award for Excellence in Science Teaching by President Bush in 1989.

When Mike retired **from Shangri La** in 2013, The Record, Orange County News reported, "There is no doubt in the future, Hoke will continue to teach all who meet him the importance of taking care of the world we live in and how to make it a better place."

Tee Shirts for Nicaragua

#### **TEE SHIRTS ARE STACKING UP!**

A few weeks ago, Rotarian Kristie Fuselier, Director of Student Activities at West Brook, was seen toting in a number of plastic bags of tee shirts from the school. A number of Rotarians have also been spotted delivering bags, boxes and stacks of shirts for a District-wide service project: **collecting tee shirts for Nicaragua**.

A tee shirt can be cut front and back, hemmed and turned into a diaper. Nicaraguan youths are trained to operate foot pedal powered sewing machines so the cutting and hemming are taken care of locally. This becomes a winwin situation for them, the children earn income for their family, and Nicaraguan mothers have access to inexpensive diapers.



Members of the Interact Club at Monsignor Kelly Catholic High School helped to fill the truck with shirts they collected from fellow students. The students were happy to stay after the school bell rang to help load the boxes and bundles into the delivery van.



# "State of the City of Beaumont"

Kyle Hayes gave members a State of the City address today that encompassed objectives of the city and projects that are in the works now and the near future.

The objectives of the City are clear:

- Do we have the right team? (best people we have ever had);
- Where are we going? (making our City a desirable place to live, work and play);
- Did we get it done? (evaluate every project objectively).

The City's mission is to provide quality services and that includes maintaining great financial condition, improving the facilities we have, addressing capital programs and revitalizing downtown. Of the \$250 million annual budget: 34% comes from sales tax, 29% comes from property taxes and 13% comes from industrial partners.

Kyle updated us on the oil and gas royalties at the airport. The City has received \$54.5 million dollars so far and most of it has been used on road projects: 7<sup>th</sup> Street from Wall to IH-10, Washington Blvd from MLK to IH-10, Old Dowlen Rd to 105 and the NW Parkway which will clear traffic congestion around the mall area.

The Concord Road project (E. Lucas to 105) is being managed by TXDoT and Federal funds (result of Hurricane Ike). Other road projects include Delaware and Magnolia.

Other projects in the City include:

- new tennis courts and building at the Municipal Courts on College;
- relocation of Fire Station 1 and 11;
- new hike and bike trail from Major Drive to Dowlen at Folsom;
- improvements at River Front Park (5 railroad tracks have been removed: a new playground, walking paths, spray park and a small arena are in the plans);
- new senior center adjacent to the Event Center;
- new public health facility in the Old Armory on College;
- excess office space in the Civic Center will house exhibits for the future Children's Museum; and,
- Hotel Beaumont is up for sale.
