Dinner and Fun with Lamar Rotaract!







The World Health Organization has declared its South East Asia region polio-free.

PROGRAM REVIEW March 26, 2014 "Providing for Seniors: At Home but Not Alone"

Dr. Paul Szuch introduced Elaine Shellenberger, Director of Nutrition and Services for Seniors, which has delivered over 6 million meals to seniors in its 30-plus year history. Elaine discussed some of the challenges associated with aging, emphasizing that one of the senior population's most important concerns is remaining in their homes as they age. \$1,662.50 is the annual cost to serve one senior citizen at home for Nutrition and Services. The annual cost for nursing home residence usually exceeds \$40,000. She then shared a video introducing the many services the organization provides to our community. These programs include Meals on Wheels, AniMeals-pet food for senior citizens' pets, transportation services, monitoring emergency services, and a dining and social location for senior citizens who can still travel but live alone.

Last year the organization provided over 4,000 meals in Southeast Texas. One of the large concerns for Nutrition and Services is the rising cost of food. The organization travels nearly 15,000 miles per week to provide services. Therefore, rising fuel costs are also a major concern. Elaine praised local volunteers who have never wavered in their support of the organization's programs.

Elaine introduced several guests who are longtime volunteers for Nutrition and Services. She shared several letters of support for the many services the organization provides. Elaine
