This was the first Rotary club meeting. They decided to call the new club "Rotary" after the practice of rotating meeting locations."



Program Review

PROGRAM REVIEW April 2, 2014

"Invasive Pests in a Shrinking World"

Dr. Roger Gold made his third Beaumont Rotary presentation. He is a Professor of Entomology at Texas A & M. Bill Clark presented Dr. Gold to the club.

Dr. Gold's topic was "Invasive Pests in a Shrinking International World." The four pests who have presented themselves in Southeast Texas have all been "imported" from other continents. The raspberry "crazy" ants are now present in 27 countries and counting. They invade just about everything, including fire ants, but are especially dangerous in computer and electronic systems. They are causing more and more horticultural problems. If invaded, your back yard will not be a pleasant place to sit. The treatment needs professional help.

Red fire ants have been reported from South America. They are widespread in this area and are moving north. They sting, as most southeast Texans are aware. They are dangerous to small animals for their sting and in storms they are able to float on top of the water making swimming pools and other standing water dangerous. A lot can be done to prevent these ants, both personally and professionally.

There are some foreign flies who are able to deal with these ants, but the result of their invasion is still uncertain.

Bed bugs are still lingering, and the more international travel there is the more they will invade us. No diseases have been connected to these bugs, but they are not easy to deal with. If they are in your home, you really need professional help. One small thing that can be done when traveling: don't put your suitcase on the bed.

Formosan termites are the fourth species Dr. Gold discussed, and they are highly destructive. Bill Clark has been credited with first identifying these termites in the early 1960s. We may know them as the "snow storm" termites of May, sometimes called Mother's Day termites. They originally come from Pacific Rim countries and they are destructive to trees and wood. They eat from the inside out and their damage might not be immediately seen. Yearly check-ups would be a good idea for these pests.
