

PROGRAM REVIEW April 30, 2014 "Lessons Learned from El Paso ISD Board of Managers"

Our speaker at Rotary this week was Dee Margo, Board President for the El Paso Independent School District. Standing in for Jim Rich, the Chairman of the Government Affairs Division of the Beaumont Chamber of Commerce, Tom Broussard, introduced Mr. Margo to a packed house.

After a widespread cheating scandal rocked the El Paso ISD and the superintendent was convicted for his part in it, TEA appointed Dee Margo as President of a Board of Managers to replace the El Paso ISD Trustees. The El Paso ISD is the second largest employer in its area, second only to Fort Bliss.

As the result of the fraudulent actions, as well as the disruptive bickering and dysfunctional Board of Trustees, the Board of Managers have been in place since December 2012. The FBI has a continuing investigation in progress.

Mr. Margo highlighted some steps taken by the El Paso ISD Board of Managers in the process of this major change. He made recommendations including the value of having and using a thorough audit. He stressed that those who are asked to serve on a BISD Board of Managers should do so willingly as it is a most important contribution.

Dee said, "Unless your workforce is educated, you will not attract people and business to your location. ... There is too much at stake for El Paso and for Beaumont."
