
FEED THE PINK POLIO PIG!

Record-Breaking Bridge Climb Highlights Convention

During the International Convention in Australia and the world record-breaking Sydney Harbour bridge climb, Rotary members raised enough money to protect 240,000 kids from polio.



Despite the physically grueling four-hour trek up and down the bridge's storied steel arches, the 340 participants kept their good spirits and stood side-by-side waving 278 flags. The event raised 110,000 Australian dollars (US\$102,300).

Rotary members cheered for each of the 26 groups as they made way through the lobby to the entrance of the bridge climb. Cloud cover hid the sun for most of the morning, but light broke through briefly as the climbers unfurled their flags, which had been tucked into their sleeves during the ascent. Helicopters circled overhead from a variety of local Sydney news stations. Climbers cheered, danced, and even broke into the "Wave" from 400 feet above ground.

Climbers from Taiwan, Australia, China, Japan, United States, and dozens of other countries and regions supported each other during the event. And in the process, they raised enough money to show the world how committed they are to polio eradication.

"Treasures of the Sam Houston Regional Library and Research Center"

Rotary Speaker for June 11 was Alana Inman, Manager of the Sam Houston Regional Library and Research Center in Liberty, Texas. Ms. Inman was introduced by John Paschall, CEO of the Better Business Bureau of Southeast Texas.

Ms. Inman stated that the Sam Houston Regional Library and Research Center is part of the Texas State Library and Archive Commission.

Alana went on to describe that the location in Liberty sits on 120 acres. The Center consists of numerous buildings, including a smaller-sized scale of the Governor's Mansion. This research center serves as a library and storage system of state and regional archives so that we can "tell the story of our past."

The Library and Archive locations store and preserve the following:

- government records;
- lists of delinquent tax records;
- judicial/court records;
- manuscripts and private papers, such as a possible diary entry of pirate Jean LaFitte; a letter of introduction of Sam Houston to Thomas Jefferson;
- storage of fine art, many photographs, blueprints, maps, and newspapers from our early years, from the region's ten counties;
- census information, and cemetery records; and
- Alabama-Coushatta Tribe of Texas records.
