Group Study Exchange continues with District funding and the through September 8. Applicants will be interviewed arrangements are made for an exchange with District 4540 (Brazil, northern part of Sao Paulo state and southern part of Minas Gerais state, with 4 cities over 200,000 pop.). Our team will travel there from <u>May 11 through June 10, 2014</u>. The Brazilian team will be here March 31 - April 28.

Applications for Team Members are being accepted through September 30. Applicants will be interviewed on Saturday, October 19.





PROGRAM REVIEW August 7, 2013

"Sabine-Neches Waterway Deepening Project: Where Are We? and What's Next?"

Clayton Henderson, Assistant General Manager of the Sabine-Neches Navigation District, gave club members an idea of what they do and where they want to go. Their job in managing a federal waterway is to act as a liaison between industry and USACEC, channel maintenance planning and funding by maintaining 1, 3 and 5 year forecast plans, and asking Congress to improve the Channel. The Ship Channel, from 13 miles out of the Gulf to the Port of Beaumont (a total of 42 miles), has a Waterway Deepening Project underway.

The project will deepen our 40 foot channel to 50 feet in order to handle larger vessels and to make the curves more accessible to larger ships. The other part of the improvement is to develop better docking facilities so that ships do not have a long wait time to enter the ports.

This Waterway is an economic lifeline for this area and is the number one area for the shipment of fuel, military equipment and jet fuel for the military. With the Panama chail improvements that are happening now, this area will benefit directly and the need to develop an export waterway mind set is now.

Right now the District is fully permitted and "shovel-ready" to go. The result of the project will be billions of dollars in economic gain and thousands more jobs for SE Texas. The District is hopeful that Congress will give the go ahead by the end of the year and construction will begin in 2016. The cost of the project is \$1.6 billion over the 15 year construction period.
