Our Rotary Speaker for September 11, 2013, was Chris Fisher, Port Director and CEO. Mr. Fisher was introduced by Port Commissioner and Rotarian Pat Anderson.

Mr. Fisher is responsible for the day-to-day operation of the Port of Beaumont. As titled, his talk covered the "Expansion and Diversification of the Port of Beaumont."

Chris talked about:

- * waterway commerce
- * port activity (annually)
- * major commodities
- * diversity of cargo-base
- * expansion
- * rail services

Waterway Commerce:

- * energy, petrochemical, commercial, and military
- * natural gas, crude oil, gas, and jet fuel

Port Activity (annually):

The Port of Beaumont has better than average waterway-traffic:

- ~ 2.5 to 4 million tons per year
- ~ 150 to 225 vessels
- ~ 15 to 20,000 rail cars
- ~ 10 to 15,000 trucks

Major Commodities:

- bulk grain
- potash
- aggregate
- military cargo
- steel
- forest products
- wind/energy equipment
- project cargo

Diversity of cargo-base:

- * automobiles
- * container-on-barge transport
- * new dry-bulk commodities
- * liquid bulks

Expansion:

Master Plan

Rail Services:

- > BNSF
- > Union Pacific
- > Kansas City Southern

Chris stated that "expansion and diversification" relies on port revenues and revenue bonds, Federal and State grants, and Public Private Partnerships.
