





## PROGRAM REVIEW

#### October 23, 2013

"Understanding the Beaumont Rotary Foundation and The Rotary Foundation (TRF)"



PDG Roger McCabe District Foundation Chairman

President Blanchard introduced PDG Roger McCabe, who is serving as the current District 5910 Foundation Chair.

The Rotary Foundation (TRF) motto is "every Rotarian every year". This emphasizes RI's desire for every Rotarian to give at least \$100 to TRF each year. Roger bestowed two new Paul Harris Fellows upon Leonard Juncker and Sharon McCabe when discussing the ways Rotarians who contribute to TRF are recognized. He also discussed Rotary Direct, a renewing \$10 monthly contribution to TRF. He explained that Paul Harris Fellows are given as recognition to Rotarians who contribute \$1,000. Major donors to TRF are those who give \$10,000 or more.

Roger then discussed what TRF does with these contributions. The primary purpose is the polio eradication effort. He discussed several areas of focus for the remaining funds donated to TRF each year that include maternal and child care, peace and conflict resolution, etc. Funds also go to District matching grant projects.

Roger shifted the discussion to the Beaumont Rotary Foundation, and explained that the corpus of the fund is not growing, although it should be. The largest source of funding for our Foundation is our Flag Project. Roger explained that we still need financial support for our Foundation. He encouraged members to make contributions, either through our own Beaumont Rotary Foundation Direct program or through annual contributions. He presented a breakdown of expenses of our Foundation which funds the club's service projects including the "I Like Me" book project, the Layette project, scholarships, etc. He also discussed a Board approved change to allocate funds from Beaumont to TRF in honor of our club members who work on various club projects. A larger Beaumont Rotary Foundation allows us to participate more actively in global projects.
