
# Pay It Forward!

# Marti Boone Executive Director

The Rotary Speaker for October 30, 2013 was Marti Boone. Ms. Boone is the Executive Director of the Be An Angel Foundation, based in Houston. Becky Mason. Centennial President, introduced Marti.

Marti Boone's 25-year career in the non-profit world has allowed her to assist thousands of families within the Houston area. She has been the Executive Director of Be An Angel since 2001. She originally was introduced to Be An Angel as an independent grant and volunteer coordinator. Prior to her commitment to Be An Angel, she served as Executive Director for a social service agency aiding low-income families. She also worked as the Vocational Marketing Director for the Vocational Services division of Tri-County MH/MR. She serves on various non-profit boards and has received numerous leadership and non-profit awards.

Marti was excited to share the story of Be An Angel. The "Be An Angel" Foundation began about 27 years ago in Houston to "improve the quality of life for children with multi-disabilities or profound deafness."

With the community's generous support, Be An Angel provides a variety of innovative programs that provide activities, equipment and developmental-care for these children. The programs and services include:

#### **Holiday Gift Program**

Providing gifts to over 4,300 special needs students from 280 schools within 17 school districts in the Houston, Dallas and Fort Worth Areas.

#### **Barrier-Free Playgrounds**

Twenty five years ago, none of the wheelchair-bound students could participate in recess with their able bodied peers. One of the first major projects for Be An Angel was the construction of barrier-free playgrounds allowing all of the students to play together, side by side. Be An Angel has constructed 24 barrier-free playgrounds in HISD, Humble, Katy and Montgomery ISD's offering recreation to thousands of area children.

#### S.U.C.C.E.S.S. Golf

The S.U.C.C.E.S.S. Golf Tournament is a nine-hole traveling mini-golf course designed specifically for special needs children.

#### Camp For All

Each year Be An Angel coordinates a special long weekend retreat for these special children and their families.

Attending camp gives the special needs children the opportunity to continue developing their skills outside of the home and classroom environments.

#### **Respite Care**

The Summer Respite Care Program provides skilled care for medically fragile children with multiple disabilities during the summer and/or holiday season. Our Alternatives for Angels Program provides the same skilled care at the homes of qualified families year-round.

#### **Hearing Aid Program**

Be An Angel's Hearing Aid Program assists with providing hearing aids to children from low income families.

#### **Personal Equipment**

Many of these children require motorized wheel chairs and often this equipment can be financially out of reach for families. With your donations these children and their families are given a degree of independence.

## **Nutritional Program**

Assist parents in purchasing life sustaining nutritional supplements, such as Ensure, Pediasure, Nutren Jr., etc., of which they are unable to purchase on their own because of financial limitations.

# **Multi-Sensory Equipment Program**

The Multi-Sensory Equipment Program provides proactive sensory stimulation for special needs children that are mentally, visually, physically or hearing impaired.

## Snow Days

Every year in December, Be An Angel treats the T.H. Rogers HISD elementary school to "Snow Day." Over 30 tons of snow are produced as the front lawn of the school is transformed into a winter snowscape.

## School Equipment

Be An Angel helps schools provide specialized facilities that benefit children with multiple disabilities and/or profound deafness including Hydrotherapy, Sensory & Activity Labs, Barrier Free Playgrounds, and Media Literacy Labs.

The Rotary Club of Beaumont was fortunate enough to become associated with Be An Angel as planning for the Beaumont Rotary Centennial Playground began. As a partner on the Centennial project, we benefited from their playground expertise as well as discounts on equipment purchases that they were able to arrange.
