WHAT PROJECT WILL WE TAKE ON NEXT?







"A History of the YMCA and Its Focus to the Future"

This past week our speaker was Bud Oliver who recently was appointed to be the President and CEO of the YMCA of Southeast Texas. Bud began his career at the YMCA in Lincoln Nebraska and has had multiple postings across the country, before moving to Southeast Texas.

The YMCA originally started in London, England as a Bible

study class. Shortly thereafter, the idea spread to many other countries including the US in 1851. Through the years many important people have lived, or worked for the YMCA including: Ronald Reagan, Bill Clinton, BB King, Martin Luther King and many others. Even more interesting are the number of sports that were invented by employees of the "Y". For example, basketball was invented in 1891 as a way to provide children an organized team sport. When some of the staff felt that basketball was too physical, volleyball was invented in 1895. Later on, racquetball and softball were also added to the lists of sports "invented" at the Y.

The YMCA was a "first" in many other areas as well. It was the first organization to require the staff to be certified, it had the first indoor swimming pool, the first filtered swimming pool and the first "pro" football team. The Y was also instrumental in starting Toastmasters, the Gideon Society, Campfire Girls and the Peace Corps.

Today, the YMCA is in over 130 countries, has 22,000,000 members and 554,000 volunteers. Their emphasis with youth today are on reading/literacy and developing healthy eating habits
