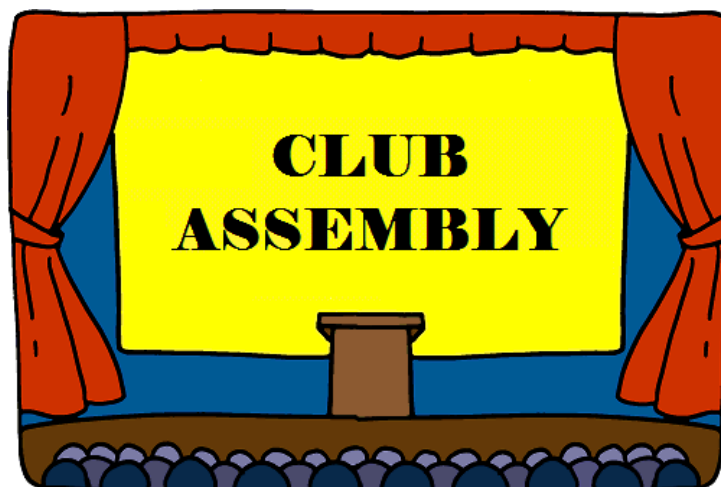


Doris A. Lockey **District Governor** **Rotary District 5910**

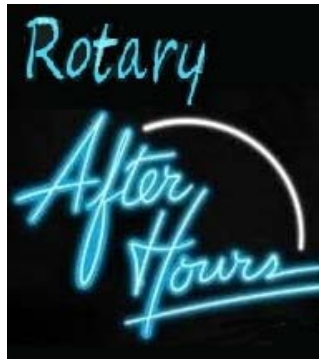

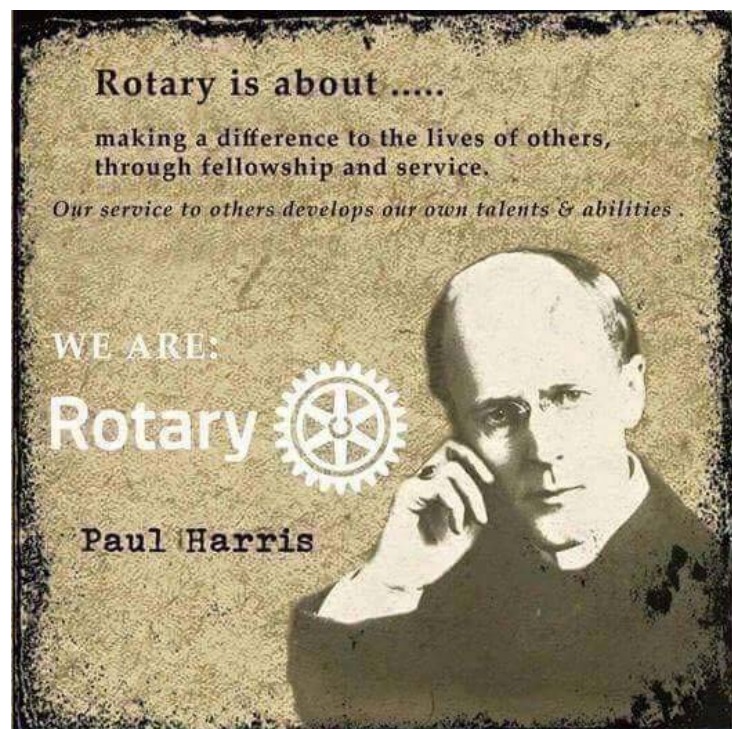
It's not Tattling. It's Telling!

"Bridging the Gap Between Law Enforcement and the Communities It Serves"

Malcolm Bales is a former FBI agent and current U.S. Attorney for the Eastern District of Texas. This area covers the eastern portion of the state reaching from Beaumont to Texarkana and includes around 5,000,000 people.

Interestingly, Bogota, Columbia is also included in the Eastern District and the reasoning is to be able to fight the crime (primarily drug related) at the source rather than waiting for it to come to Texas.

Areas of work include securities fraud, healthcare violations, and even BISD. The two main types of criminal cases that the U.S. Attorneys work are:

- **REACTIVE** – the crime is already committed and law enforcement tries to solve the case. These usually include murder, stolen cars, etc.
- **PROACTIVE** – law enforcement works proactively to stop crime before it happens. This work requires undercover personnel, confidential informants, and wiretaps to successfully bring criminals to trial.

Malcolm Bales was grateful for the hard work that the Beaumont Police do each day in maintaining peace in our community. He also challenged all police nationwide to do a better job of bridging the gap between law enforcement

and the communities they serve. This is not because they are doing a bad job but because they are already doing a great job and can always strive for better.
