





The site is ready for Phase II: building the planter beds!



THIS SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 19: - volunteers will measure and "string" mark the planter bed areas. Bring a hammer and, if you have one, a 100' tape measure. Volunteers will measure the dimensions of the beds and mark with string lines in preparation for the bed-building day.

ON SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 26, we will construct the 8"x8"x16" cinder block planter beds where some delicious homegrown vegetables will soon grow! The beds are only one block (8") tall. Volunteers will need shovels that weekend to make sure the ground under the beds is level. The work will be dirty; it is recommended that volunteers bring a pair of shoes to work in that they can take off when driving home to protect the floor of the vehicle. No power tools, generators or air compressors will be needed. Just good strong backs to lift, tote and stack!



PROGRAM REVIEW September 9, 2015

"Social Security Planning"



Dan Frick John Hixson Financial Management Professionals

Our speakers today were Daniel Frick and John Hixson, Certified Financial Planners for Financial Management Professionals. Both were introduced by Rotarian Scott Hatcher, Owner and CEO of M & D Supply.

Dan Frick graduated from Loyola with a Bachelor of Business Administration degree with a double major in Finance and International Business. Following his initial work at Merrill Lynch Global Wealth Management in Houston, Dan joined Financial Management Professionals as a financial advisor. At FMP, John works directly with clients and takes an active role in financial planning and portfolio management. John speaks frequently to civic groups, physicians, accountants and attorneys on many different financial planning topics.

Entitled "Social Security: Maximizing Your Benefits", John identified Social Security as a "part of one's financial picture....a funding stream of a larger picture that encompasses one's Accumulation Phase and one's Distribution Phase."

John went on to present an overview of Social Security, as follows:

- Social Security provides benefits to retirees, spouses of retirees, people with disabilities, and survivors of deceased workers.
- Benefits received in retirement, based upon contributions to Social Security, max out at \$31,956 at full retirement age.

Where does the revenue in Social Security come from? Deductions from paychecks (6.2% from the employer contribution, and 6.2% from the employee).

When can an individual draw from Social Security?

- Age 62, at 75% of full retirement-age benefits
- Age 66+ at full-retirement age benefits
- When benefits are delayed until age 70, those benefits increase by 8% each year the receipt of those benefits are postponed.

John Hixson was one of the first advisors in the country to receive the Fee-Only professional designation from the National Association of Personal Financial Advisors. Consecutively from 2000-2014, John was named by Medical Economics magazine as one of the 150 Best Financial Advisors in the country.

John stated that "Social Security is not bankrupt, although it does need some adjustments in order to get into a better, sustainable position." Some potential solutions that could be used are:

- increase payroll taxes
- reduce the benefit amount
- reduce cost of living adjustments
- increase full-retirement age to 70

Any of these solutions or combination of these solutions could put Social Security on solid ground. The Congressional Budget Office says that if we simply increase retirement age to 70 at least HALF of the problems with Social Security would be solved.

John concluded the presentation by stating, "Do not expect the Social Security Administration to tell you how to maximize your retirement benefits. Be informed."
