# "Restorative Justice in a Prison Setting"



Kirk Blackard Bridges for Life

Kirk Blackard's message will cover the story of the Bridges To Life restorative justice prison ministry from founding to today's impact. It is a story that is near to his heart after devoting 12 years as a volunteer with the organization.

Kirk is Chairman of the Board of Directors for Bridges To Life, a faith-based restorative justice ministry that works in prisons to help victims heal their wounds and immates change their lives and avoid a return to prison after their release. He has worked directly with hundreds of crime victims and perpetrators and has been on the organization's Board of Directors for eight years.

Kirk holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in economics from Texas A&M University and a Doctor of Jurisprudence degree from the University of Texas School of Law. He is retired from a career with Shell Oil Company, where he held several senior executive positions in Houston and London.

ROTARACT & INTERACT LEADING SERVICE PROJECT





### PROGRAM REVIEW October 14, 2015

"How Does Identity Theft Affect Me and My Business?"

Mr. Gibbs' presentation on identity theft should be a wakeup call in our technology age. Our personal information is out there waiting to be seized.

Google normally has a billion hits on Facebook in one day. The connections made on Facebook can be utilized to learn everything about us (if we share it). Someone is waiting to get your information and it could be due to marketing, information or identity theft. When someone turns that information into utilization for their use and not yours, it becomes fraudulent.

The estimated cost of this type of theft is \$22 billion dollars a year. \$3 million fake tax returns have been e filed with the IRS. And of that amount banks are not the most active "market" at only 17%. Social security numbers and drivers' licenses can be manufactured readily. Houston is a prime manufacturer market. Doctors' offices are another target for this type of crime due to the large amount of "private" data that they store.

Identity theft occurs from Facebook, medical institutions, tax returns, credit cards, drivers' licenses, social security cards, banking information, and even deceased persons. These criminals are "staying at home in their pajamas and stealing identity." The criminals are creating malware to get into your information. They have even been known to create an entirely "new" person by a combination of different people's social security numbers, drivers' license and birth dates.

The average expense of any victim to clear up the theft is \$13,500.


What can you do? Don't leave any personal information in your car, keep your items private and in your possession, be aware of who and why you are giving out personal information, check your credit score at least annually, use a good virus protector on your computer, be aware that the attack can come from someone you normally receive email from, and consider some type of identity theft protection with insurance. If you have an employee who has this

problem, give them the time to resolve the issue during day time working hours.

There is no good news on the issue of identity theft.
