On December 7, the membership will elect four Rotarians to serve on the Club's Board of Directors and one new trustee for the Beaumont Rotary Foundation for a three-year term beginning July 1, 2017.

To be eligible to be slated or nominated, "Nominees ... shall have been members of the club for at least two years, and shall have rendered at least one major service to the club. No one may serve more than three consecutive years as director, other than those serving as an officer for the year of that officer's term." (Bylaws, Article 3, Section 2)

Rotarians will vote for up to four people among the eight nominees for the Board, and for one of the three nominees for the Foundation position.

There will be lines for write-in candidates and nominations will be accepted from the floor at the meeting on December 7.

There will NOT be a meeting on Wednesday, December 14, 21 or 28.




