



T. Kelsey Lamb, Sr. 1942-43 President of the Rotary Club of Beaumont

The T. Kelsey Lamb, Sr. Award for Business Ethics is presented annually to a Beaumont Rotarian who consistently exhibits the highest ethical standards represented by the Rotary Four-Way Test in his or her chosen vocation.

The original criteria for the award explains:

- 1. Nominees must be a member in good standing of the Rotary Club of Beaumont.
- 2. Nominees will have exhibited high ethical standards in their chosen vocation arising from a specific incident or by their consistent actions over a period of time.

First presented in 1996, the T. Kelsey Lamb, Sr. Award for Business Ethics has annually recognized some of the

Club's outstanding members. In 2017, this prestigious honor was presented to Dana Timaeus.
