



Rotary Goes to School! Summer Reading for First Graders at Martin Elementary



According to research, students without access to books during the summer months fall behind in reading when compared to those who have easy access to books in their homes and/or visits to the local library. That theory readily asserts that children need to own books that they can read and enjoy when school is not in session and they have limited access to books. This idea caused the Board of Directors to design our next literacy project: to give students of Martin Elementary books to read to keep their love of reading alive during the long summer months. The principal eagerly agreed to have the first grade students benefit from this project which is being funded by the Beaumont Rotary Foundation and a matching grant from Rotary District 5910.

If you missed the first opportunity to "go to school" and help the children select books, don't worry. Chair Matt McCallon has organized dates when Rotarians are needed to label each book, personalizing it for the child, and filling the bags with the books the children selected. The bags of each child's personal library will be sent home during the last week of the school year.

PROGRAM REVIEW May 9, 2018

"Beaumont, Texas: Amazing Marsh & Birding"

Our speaker today was Chris Draths with the Cattail Marsh and Wetlands Education Center. Ms. Draths was introduced by our President-Elect Lynn Castle.

Chris Draths is a fourth generation Beaumonter and, while trained as an RN, she has been an active volunteer in the community. She admits her most rewarding and interesting work is with foster children as a CASA volunteer. Chris is a spokesperson for the Magnolia Garden Club, a civic organization focused on conservation, education and horticulture.

Chris delivered a wonderful pictoral presentation of the various species of migratory birds, which visit, nest, and migrate here in Southeast Texas, and specifically in the Cattail Marsh. The Cattail Marsh Education Center is presently under construction and expected to be completed in 2018. Cattail Marsh has had over 358 identified species of birds identified along with otters and gators!

Several years back, the City of Beaumont began building a cost effective initiative that harnessed the power of nature while filtrating the water system. These wetlands are a result.

Located near Tyrrell Park, this location attracts an incredible diversity of waterbirds throughout the year. The 52 foot boardwalk leads to a state-of-art wrap-around classroom, with breathtaking views of the wetlands' abundant wildlife. This boardwalk provides two covered platforms, and is accessible by way of complimentary parking and pedestrian access. Groundbreaking was started in October of 2017.

Beaumont is legendary among birders, thanks to its position on not one but two migratory flyways: the Central and Mississippi. Migratory flyways are routes that birds depend on between their breeding and wintering spots. The flyways are used by our feathered friends because they are clear of mountains and offer plenty of food and water along the way.

Chris showed dozens and dozens of photos of the beautiful birds that have been identified at Cattail Marsh and then got everyone involved in a contest to name the birds. Two tables of Rotarians and guests earned high marks and were awarded a beautiful native plant to take home. Working by herself on the test, President Elect Lynn Castle, an avid birder, earned 90%!

Dean Conwell, Executive Director of the Beaumont Convention & Visitors Bureau, surprised everyone with a copy of a beautiful book titled "Beaumont, Texas - The Best Birding On The Upper Texas Gulf Coast" and a reference booklet called "Birding Itinerary." Some lucky members of the audience left with a "Beaumont Birdie" as another promotion for the birding opportunity in Beaumont.

Everyone left with a smile, a bit of new knowledge, and quite proud of this unique attraction found in Beaumont, Texas!
