

PROGRAM REVIEW May 16, 2018

"Beaumont Strong!"

The Mayor's signature "it's another great day in Beaumont" began her talk concerning the impact of Hurricane Harvey on our city's assets, leadership, resources and citizens. In a disaster mode the Mayor becomes the Emergency Manager, but there is a permanent person on staff who has that job and title throughout the year.

Harvey's prediction of 15 to 20 inches of rain turned into 50-64 inches before Harvey was through with the City's Riverfront Park, the only city asset lost to the river. The City is working with FEMA on funding the recovery of the Park which is estimated to be \$25 million. It is likely that the City will end up with being responsible for 10% of that cost and FEMA 90%.

Beaumont spent four days as an island with a significant loss to the water supply. Loeb and Lawson, the two water supply sources, were restored nine days later. In the meantime, a partnership approach between the city, state and corporate partners used river water to set up a bypass station to the water treatment plant on Pine Street. This ingenious approach to

solving the city's loss of water served the city well and citizens were soon able to access water. If that solution had not worked, Becky estimated that the City would have been without water for two to three months.

Overall the planning and resourcefulness of city employees, the state and corporate partners went smoothly. Debris pick-up was very good and much better controlled than some other areas in the county. During the storm, the City's 311 service became a very valuable tool to help people who needed non-emergency assistance.

The City is working with FEMA on buyouts of property. Two thousand two hundred properties were damaged in the city and of that number 80% were not in the flood plain.
