



PROGRAM REVIEW October 25, 2017

"Polio: The Last Out in the Last Inning"

Since 2002, Jo Anne Settles has been chair of the District 5930 (south Texas) Polio Eradication Committee. She has given more than 100 presentations throughout the US about polio and Rotary's drive to eradicate the disease. She even travelled to India in 2003 to participate in a National Immunization Day and showed us a number of slides about her experience there.

Jo Anne told us there are three types of the polio virus: Type 1, 2 and 3. Type 3 is gone and we believe Type 2 is as well. Unfortunately, the most aggressive and devastating Type 1 is still around. It is spread through the mouth and nose, reproduces in the human intestine, and then moves into the blood stream and throughout the body. It causes paralysis, usually in the lower limbs and frequently causes the victims to require help breathing in an iron lung for the rest of their lives.

In 1952 there were 558,000 cases in the United States. Today there are none. In fact, there are only 12 known cases in the world today, 7 in Afghanistan and 5 in Pakistan. Through the work of many volunteers, donation of funds from Rotary, the Gates Foundation and others, we are very close to totally eradicating the disease. However, the remaining cases are in areas that are extremely remote or dangerous because of opposition to the effort. Volunteers have been killed while trying to save children 5 and under from contracting this terrible disease.

According to Jo Anne, we are trying to get the last out in the last inning, the very hardest part. That is why we need to continue our support of the effort through our donations to Rotary International. Jo Anne says we are going to finish the job!
