Sources of Charitable Funds

The funds that the club uses for our charitable projects come from a variety of sources. Some events, such as the Fall Festival, Crab Feed, and Golf Tournament, generate revenue from the attendees above and beyond the costs. More importantly, these events, and our Eastern Elegance dinner count on significant contributions from our Corporate and individual sponsors. We could not achieve most of our good work without this support. A third source of funds is the donations from Cupertino Rotarians to The Rotary Foundation. Some of this money is used to fund global projects such as polio eradication and International scholarships, but much comes back to the club as matching funding for our own international projects. The last source of funds is the distribution from our Endowment Foundation.


In addition to the ongoing programs, I have several initiatives that I hope to accomplish this year.

AVENUES OF SERVICE

COMMUNITY SERVICE

Service Above Self, one of Rotary's most cherished axioms is clearly demonstrated through Community Service. This year, our club provided the bulk of funding to purchase a \$25K van for our partner, West Valley Community Services. More than 1,000 hours of volunteer work hours and over \$25,000 were devoted to projects that made seniors' homes safer; delivered turkey and trimmings to more than 400 community residents; designed and built a garden to help elementary school students learn about sustainable and eco-friendly produce; recognized outstanding artists and writers; and renovated two group homes for those with special needs.

In partnership with Staples and local PTA organizations, Rotary will provide each teacher at Faria, Lincoln, Stevens Creek and Garden Gate Schools nearly \$100/ea for needed supplies to start this school year. Additionally, Rotarians utilized their skills as pumpkin carvers, barbeque grillers, painters, builders, planters and cheer-givers to make sure that our local community benefited. We supported young people and seniors, the disabled and the disadvantaged, and the hungry and the homeless. Our projects lifted the spirits of others, built bridges to higher quality of lives and showcased Rotary's commitment to building communities through service.

YOUTH SERVICE

Building confidence, self-esteem, and leadership skills is fostered through the programs of Youth Service. The high-school students, called Interactors, are mentored through Rotary Advisors. They raise money and do projects of their own design. A dozen juniors attended the Rotary Youth Leadership Academy (RYLA) Camp, a proven program for instilling the attributes of tomorrow's leaders today. Sponsorship of an inbound exchange student who attended Monta Vista High School enriched many lives. Cupertino Rotary also sponsors Girl Scout and Boy Scout troops, another path to leadership for our youth. We are proud to provide six scholarships of \$1,500 to deserving DeAnza College students this year.

Events such as our Kid's Fishing, Kid's Shopping Day and Dr. Seuss Reading Day connect our Rotarians with the younger children of our community-brightening their days, and building their skills. These annual programs delight Rotarians as well.

VOCATIONAL SERVICE

The Vocational Service Committee produced and delivered a Job Search Support Group that inspired, encouraged, instructed, and took action towards finding employment for over 192 people. The weekly support group kept many from living in despair by motivating them towards new opportunities to recreate their lives. Over 50% of the participants were successful in finding jobs, thanks to our Chairs, Jim Gibson and Chuck Devine and other Rotarians who took the time to instruct, share and network with the group.

Through our Vocational Service activities, we also granted funds to 16 teachers to let them add technology, fund field trips and purchase software to inspire Cupertino high school students to explore our ever changing world.

INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

One of the strengths of Rotary is its worldwide scope. It operates in over 200 countries and territories around the world. The Rotary Club of Cupertino partners with a wide variety of organizations to deliver services to those in need around the world. Here are just a few examples:

The Shin Shin Educational Foundation is a Bay Area based, non-profit organization that helps construct, remodel and rebuild primary schools in the remote, rural and despondent regions of China. 325 schools in 25 provinces or municipalities have been renovated so far. They are a strategic partner that we have worked with on several projects including school supplies, computers, and library books and equipment in locations throughout China.

Pratham, which means "first" in Sanskrit, was founded in the slums of Mumbai in 1994 with UNICEF support. Today, Pratham's direct urban programs, including pre-schools, community libraries and remedial learning programs reach hundreds of thousands of children every year.

The Sankara Eye Foundation is a nonprofit organization with a mission of "Vision 20/20 by the year 2020" to eliminate curable blindness in India. Recently, Cupertino Rotary concluded several grants for buses for the Sankara rural outreach program.

FUND DEVELOPMENT

Our Global Elegance dinner has emerged as the premier fundraising event for Cupertino Rotary's International endeavors around the world. It is a classic example of partnering with local and worldwide non-profits, such as the Shin-Shin Educational Foundation, Pratham USA and the Sankara Eye Foundation to foster life-changing projects around the world.

The Cupertino Fall Festival is Cupertino's premier Community Festival, an annual fundraiser held in partnership with the City of Cupertino and the World Journal, the Bay Area's largest Chinese language newspaper. It is a fun and educational event for the whole family

All the crab you can eat and more was in evidence at the annual Crab Feed night at St. Joseph's Parish Hall. This event is a roll up your sleeves and indulge for a great cause, our Youth Services programs.

This year's major beneficiary of our Golf Classic was the Hospice of the Valley's Palliative Care Clinic.
